Judge Michael Screnock earned 59% (5,330) of the vote on February 20th with 9,084 votes cast in WALCO. The April race for the Supreme Court will be between Judge Screnock and Judge Dallet.

...Watching our president give his outstanding 1st State of the Union Address this past Tuesday and how the Democrats behaved only emboldened me to fight liberalism even more.
