### Here is the latest from UMCOR on Hurricane Florence:

The United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) has already mobilized in response to these natural disasters.

UMCOR has already awarded \$10,000 in emergency grants to both the North Carolina and South Carolina Conferences for immediate use in response to Florence.

UMCOR also reports that both conferences are as prepared as possible to respond to the potential damage caused by Hurricane Florence and is asking that those wishing to assist to **please not self-deploy**. Even those who are trained and badged ERTs need to wait until a formal call is put out by the conference and/or your district ERT leaders.

Cleaning Kits, Tool Trailers and other supplies have been strategically placed throughout the region. Moreover, experienced Early Response Teams (ERTs) and Disaster Response Coordinators (DRCs) are prepared to bring supplies into affected areas and begin cleanup and assessment for long-term assistance when conditions are safe for entry.

Christina and Joe Putnam need our prayers. Joe is hospitalized at the moment and dealing with several health issues.


**Lynnette Engelholm** is having health issues, please remember her in your prayers.
