## DATA PRIVACY NOTICE

### Your personal data – what is it?

Personal data relates to a living individual who can be identified from that data. Identification can be by the information alone or in conjunction with any other information in the data controller's possession or likely to come into such possession. The processing of personal data is governed by [the General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 (the "GDPR")1].

### Who are we?

Resilience-ppe is the data controller (contact details below). This means it decides how your personal data is processed and for what purposes.

### How do we process your personal data?

Resilience-ppe complies with its obligations under [the GDPR] by keeping personal data up to date; by storing and destroying it securely; by not collecting or retaining excessive amounts of data; by protecting personal data from loss, misuse, unauthorised access and disclosure and by ensuring that appropriate technical measures are in place to protect personal data.

### We use your personal data for the following purposes: -

- € For performance reporting - To provide relevant and comparative reporting to yourself and you support team on your health, wellbeing and progress.
- € For comparative studies – To enable us to provide a comparison of data between athletes to enable informed decision making by the relevant Subject Matter Experts on athlete performance
- € To administer membership records;
- € To manage our employees and volunteers;
- € To maintain our own accounts and records.
- € Our processing also includes the use of CCTV systems for the prevention of crime.
- € To operate the Resilience-ppe web site and deliver the services that individuals have requested.
- € To inform individuals of news, events, activities or services running at Resilience-ppe
- € To contact individuals via surveys to conduct research about their opinions of current services or of potential new services that may be offered.

### What is the legal basis for processing your personal data?

These fall under either article 6 or article 9 – dealt with separately below.

#### Article 6 processing

- Consent of the data subject - [link to the "Consent Form" at the end of this notice].
- Processing is necessary for the performance of a contract with the data subject or to take steps to enter into a contract



Processing is necessary for the legitimate interests of the data controller or a third party [e.g. your athletics club, sports team or governing body] to monitor and report on your health, wellbeing and performance, except where such interests are overridden by the interests, rights or freedoms of the data subject.

#### Article 9 Processing

- Explicit consent of the data subject [link to “Consent Form”];
- Processing relates to personal data manifestly made public by the data subject

#### **Sharing your personal data**

Your personal data will be treated as strictly confidential and will be shared only with Resilience-ppe staff, and your relevant support staff [e.g. coach]. We will only share your data with third parties outside of your support staff with your consent.

#### **How long do we keep your personal data?**

We keep your personal data for no longer than reasonably necessary for a period of seven year to analysis trends and changes in performance and maturation

#### **Your rights and your personal data Unless subject to an exemption [under the GDPR], you have the following rights with respect to your personal data: -**

- € The right to request a copy of your personal data which the Resilience-ppe holds about you;
- € The right to request that the Resilience-ppe corrects any personal data if it is found to be inaccurate or out of date;
- € The right to request your personal data is erased where it is no longer necessary for Resilience-ppe to retain such data;
- € The right to withdraw your consent to the processing at any time
- € The right to request that the data controller provide the data subject with his/her personal data and where possible, to transmit that data directly to another data controller, (known as the right to data portability),
- € The right, where there is a dispute in relation to the accuracy or processing of your personal data, to request a restriction is placed on further processing;
- € The right to object to the processing of personal data,
- € The right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioners Office.

Further processing If we wish to use your personal data for a new purpose, not covered by this Data Protection Notice, then we will provide you with a new notice explaining this new use prior to commencing the processing and setting out the relevant purposes and processing conditions. Where and whenever necessary, we will seek your prior consent to the new processing.
