From the Desk of Director Alice...

SEACM is working with nearly 200 DACA recipients from the North State with the vast majority residing in Shasta County. USCIS (U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services) is no longer accepting new applicants but is accepting two year renewals. There are four parts to the renewal. In addition, you must pay \$495 and submit two passport photos. The last form asks you to write why you want to renew your Work Permit. The following letter is from a SEACM client, graduate of high school here in Shasta County who submitted this letter as his reason to renew his DACA Work Permit. He said I could share his letter but he prefers to remain anonymous.

"Dear USCIS:

Thank you, thank you for the opportunity you have given me these past few years, allowing me to work legally in this country and have the economic independence I have always strived for. I am eternally gracious to have the opportunity to make my own living in a legal, responsible manner. The United States has given me all I can ask for ever since I was three. This country is all I have ever known. If it weren't for this country I would have had to endure the same hardships that my parents had. The United States has allowed me to live a life full of joy, ambition, and privilege.

I wish to contribute to my society. I want to continue working and give back to the country that gave me so much. If it weren't for this work permit I wouldn't be where I am today. My parents instilled in me a great work ethic and a sense of responsibility to do my part in my community. I hope to one day fulfill my dreams through my hard work. I would just like to restate how appreciative I am and I hope it is not too late.
