What we offer!

All Leisure World residents are encouraged to take advantage of all the services the Computer Learning Center has to offer.

Located in Clubhouse 2, the Center offers use of both desktop MAC and Windows desktop computers running the latest operating systems and other useful Software programs.

There are several color laser printers for printing and scanning on a first come, first serve basis (there is a nominal charge of the pages printed or copied). Also stereo headsets are available for your use.

All of the MAC's and PC's and most of the color laser printers are part of a dedicated secure High Speed wireless network managed by the Computer Learning Center.

Clubhouse 2 also has a free Wi-Fi (LW-Guest) connection for you to use that is operated by LWMC, but this is NOT part of the Computer Learning Center network.

Additionally, the Center offers training classes, Laptops for training classes and one-on-one support when resources are available.

The center has both MAC and Windows PC workstations set up to accommodate Individuals with Disabilities. The stations have larger Flat screen monitors, stereo headsets, special keyboards and mice.
