St John Fisher on Psalm 37

“Many times sin is compared to a serpent. A serpent has a head, a body and a tail, and so does sin. For when a man feels the first instigation or stirring to sin, undoubtedly the serpent's head is there. When he consents afterward to that same instigation, he allows the serpent's body to enter. And at last, when he completes the sin indeed, then the venomous tail of the serpent is entered. Unless you resist and withstand the head, that is to say, the first suggestion, it shall be very hard for you to exclude sin, for whenever the serpent can get his head inside, he quickly brings after it the rest of his body. And so likewise the sin: if the straight passage is opened for the first hint or stirring, he quickly draws after him his whole body and never ceases till he comes to the highest part of the soul. Sin advances himself and lifted up far above the mind, which ought to be the head of the soul. And this, in truth, is a great misery, of which this holy prophet David makes his complaint, saying, *all parts of my body are without rest because my sins are exalted far above my head...*” – **St John Fisher.**
