

Live Laudato Si: Did you know there are currently **7 varieties of plastic**, some of which are not recycled. At present **8 million tonnes of plastic ends up in the sea every year.** Experts estimate that plastic is eaten by *31 species of marine mammals* and more than *100 species of sea birds*. When we pollute Creation, we pollute ourselves. Frequently no measures are taken until after people's health has been irreversibly affected. However, We CAN **Live Laudato Si** by making wise shopping choices, by asking our MP to support the ban of microbeads and by campaigning e.g. with Greenpeace against plastic pollution.
