Notices Regarding the Sacraments - Baptism: I have now had some requests for Baptism which is the Sacrament through which we are made God's children. The rules of the church are clear that the parish priest must be convinced that the family are practicing their faith and can form their children in the faith. This is usually through regular attendance at Mass on Sunday and the practice of the faith in the family through prayers and discussions of the faith. If the parish priest feels that this is not the case, he may defer baptism till a time when the family can demonstrate that they are truly and sincerely practising their faith. Also, people are asked to be diligent when choosing Godparents that they are fitting and truly fulfil that role. Care should be taken that they are not chosen like a bridesmaid or best man is, or because they are nice, it is because they are living the faith and can be an excellent example of the faith to the children, that they are of good faith and moral standing. For example: the Godparents chosen are married in church and not living together. They must be also 16 years and over and have made their Sacraments of initiation, that is they are baptised, and have made their first holy communion and confirmation. This is so that the child being baptised can have good faith role models to follow. Please do speak to Fr Neil if you would like more information,

Marriages: If you live in the parish of St John Fisher our parish is responsible for filling in all paper work even if you are getting married in another church or abroad. You need to give a minimum of 6 months notice of marriage so the administration and marriage preparation can begin. Please speak to Fr Neil if you have any questions.
