

As part of the chaplaincy team of the hospital in Medway, I was asked to attend an induction course. It was wonderful to spend some time with medical and admin staff all getting a crash course in working at Medway. There was an interesting part of the course, where the presentation was on approach to work and patient care. How despite the stress of daily commute and all the trials at home, that we put the care of the patient first. A positive cheerful attitude apparently led to 40% increase in productivity. In the gospel we are given the greatest commandment in the bible. The Lord bids us to

"Love one another as I have loved you." Our love for one another is not to be pretense or insincere, we are not simply to be nice, we are called to go the extra mile. It is wonderful to see this already in our community. How the sick are visited and taken Holy Communion, how parents struggle to bring their infants and little ones to Mass, how people spend time in caring and looking after the parish grounds, concerns about the environment and living simply, outreach to the homeless to name but a few. It is wonderful to see all your efforts. We also need to think of really building a parish community. As we have three Masses on Sundays, we have three communities. We need to see how we could at least once in a while, bring these communities together. To gather outside of Mass to spend time with our Lord in devotion, catechesis and fellowship. To deepen our faith through prayer and learning about our faith, through frequent confession
