Newsletter –7th July 2019 Fourteenth Sunday (C)

Readings: Isaiah 66:10-14; Galatians 6: 14-18; Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20 <u>Responsorial Psalm</u>:. Cry out with joy to God all the earth. <u>Gospel acclamation</u>: Alleluia, alleluia! I call you friends, says the Lord, because I have made known to you everything I have learnt from my Father. Alleluia!

What do priests do on a retreat? It is a time to rest and recharge, catch up on spiritual reading, prayer and sleep. I went for my retreat at Quarr Abbey in the Isle of Wight, a Benedictine community of 8 monks. The monk's life is a balance of prayer, study and work set around the rule of St Benedict and the Liturgy of the hours (daily prayers). The monks day starts at 5.30am with sung vigils. Though I couldn't rise up at that time I joined them for their lauds (morning prayer) at 7.00am. Then after breakfast was terce (mid morning Prayer) with the community Mass at 9.00am, where I remembered all of you in my prayers. Then there was sext (midday prayer) and lunch at 1.00pm. Followed by none (afternoon prayer) at 2.20pm and vespers (evening prayer) at 500pm and supper at 700pm and the day ends with *compline* (night prayers) at 8.00pm. The monks work very hard. They grow produce, have a thriving apiary, keep chickens and pigs, a tea room and book bindery. The liturgy is beautifully sung in Latin and English. It was wonderful to see many young men in their 20's exploring their call to serve the Lord as a Benedictine monk. All the meals are taken in silence with spiritual reading at lunch and supper. The meals are simple and hearty and often include items from the monastery produce. The monks only have one day off in a year. The peace and tranquillity can really work wonders for us, who are so used to so much noise and the busy nature of our lives. The monks are welcoming and I recommend people to go. There are also wonderful places to stay and visit in the island.

In the Gospel reading the Lord sends his disciples in mission. The church is always missionary in its nature. Do we think that the Lord has chosen us and sends us in mission? What about our families, friends, and people at work? Do I keep my faith as just my business? How prepared am I to share my faith? How can we as people of the parish form groups, to make Christ present in us and also share him with others? How is the Lord God calling me here and now to witness to him? Let us pray for discernment and courage, that the Lord may help us to form ourselves and those he has given us to be his joyful disciples. God bless, Fr Neil.
