Assisted Suicide “Call for Conscience”: On March 3, you were made aware that the June 2017 Assisted Suicide legislation mandates or expects medical professionals to assist patients requesting assisted death, even though they may not wish to do so.

There is an ecumenical project between Saskatchewan churches and the Coalition for HealthCare to have as many people as possible write the Saskatchewan Minister of Health to ask them to bring forward legislation that could protect medical professionals should they chose not to provide medically assisted death. Similar legislation has been passed in Manitoba.

A pre-printed letter is available in the lobby of the church on your left as you leave the worship area. Sign the letter if you chose, leave it with me, or drop it off in Len’s office. March 31 will be the last day we will collect letters. Thank you! **Brian Wonnick**
