## Unpaid toll road and myki fines out of control

Out of control fines are becoming a major problem in Frankston North, with some people accruing massive transport fines worth tens of thousands of dollars.

The Frankston-based Peninsula Community Legal Centre has set up a free weekly fines clinic to help people struggling to repay their infringement debts in response to the growing number of people contacting the centre for help,

Out-of-control fines are a particular problem in relation to the use of toll roads. People don't seem to realise how quickly the cost of the travel can escalate due to the combined cost of fines and enforcement costs, which can sometimes see people owe thousands of times the amount they should have paid.

Left unpaid, a fine can quickly spiral out of control. For example, a day trip pass on Eastlink costs less than \$10.00, but travelling without a pass results in a fine of \$155.00. If the driver does not pay the fine, the enforcement costs keep rising and in the end it can end up costing \$350 for one day of driving on Eastlink. The costs of being caught on public transport without a valid myki ticket can similarly be very high.

Fines can be a more serious matter than other debts because payment is enforced by the Sherriff's office, and can even result in a jail term if the amount owing is very large. This is different to other debts like telephone or electricity bills because if people do not pay these bills they will not end up in jail for it.
