The Importance of Reading

There has been a lot of discussion in the news recently about the importance of reading at home with your child on a consistent basis. This seems such a simple thing but the difference it can make to your child's learning is amazing. Reading is the cornerstone of ALL education and parents need to make sure their child is reading every night. Children can read alone, with their parents or being read to. In the age of technology and social media, the amount of books read (compared with over a decade ago) has dropped making it more important than ever to build our children's ability to read through nightly reading sessions.


The old saying of 'if there is no investment, there is no dividend' applies not only to money, but also to the time that we are prepared to put into supporting our children at their reading development. As a father of two children it is important that I continue to 'invest' in them (no matter how busy or tired I am when I get home from work) and find the time to support them with their reading practice and general homework.

At the end, the 'dividend' will be that I have raised children that have had the best chance to reach their full potential and be the best they can be. That is a big pay-off for investing a little bit of time each night.



EVERYONE ON THE PLANET SHOULD RECYCLE! By 3/4D






