Q- If riding Great American/USDF qualifying, please specify which division and pay the additional \$10 qualifying fee for each class entered. Please specify Open (O), Adult Amateur (AA), Jr. Young Rider (Jr./YR), on entry form. If not specified, you will be placed in the Open (O) division. Management reserves the right to cancel, combine, split classes, change arenas, or limit the number of rides per rider to facilitate the schedule. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry.

****Classes 105/205 and 111/211 are included in a circuit class with the "Magic City Dressage I & II" (hosted by White Aspen Farm, in Billings , MT) June 24 & 25, 2017. There will be 2 separate awards of \$150- one for each level.** Rules are as follows: 1) There is no extra fee to participate in the Circuit classes, HOWEVER, you will need to compete in all 4 shows to have your scores qualify for the cash prize(s). 2) The rider/horse combination with the highest percent average for all 4 classes will win the cash award(s). 3) Circuit classes are open to all divisions so you must indicate on your entry if you are planning on competing for the cash prize by marking your entry with a ** after your class description on your entry form. You will mark your division to qualify for USDF/IDEA championships as normal. 4) You can ride in the circuit class provided it is in a consecutive level (Intro/Training, Training/1st, 1st/2nd). 5) Cash prizes to be awarded after closing of the classes at "Dressage Under the Big Sky II" in Bozeman Sunday July 30th. For further questions of circuit class rules please contact show management.

ENTRIES: Mail complete entry to: Mike Taylor, Show Secretary, 1352 W. Syphon Road, Pocatello, ID 83204. Make checks payable to: **Bozeman Dressage Society**. Classes filled on a first-come first-served basis according to postmark or email from electronic entry. Entries not accepted without full payment, all signatures, and copies of membership cards or www.eqverification.org printout. You may use www.egentries.com or the DUBS Entry Form that can be found at bozemandressagesociety.com. Juniors must provide Medical Release Form. Adult Amateurs must show USEF Amateur card. Freestyle entries must include a copy of the qualifying test (60% score at highest test of level) with the exception of FEI YR and Junior Freestyles. Post entries will only be accepted if time slots are available with a late fee of \$15. Out of state competitors must provide a current negative Coggins and health certificate.

VACCINATION NOTICE: Exhibitors are reminded of USEF's new vaccination policy, effective 12/1/15; see GR845 for details. Download the form from: <https://files.usef.org/assets/R8HwrnhakZ8/equinevaccinationrecord.pdf> and bring the completed form, signed by your veterinarian, with you to the competition. If you select an alternative option under the rules, please bring required documentation. Competition Management reserves the right to review vaccination documentation. Non-compliant entries may be quarantined or denied permission to unload, and will not be allowed to compete nor to mingle with other horses. **No refunds will be given if right to compete is denied because the vaccination documentation is missing or incomplete.**

SPECIAL CLASSES:

- Exhibition Leadline (Class 140 & 240) is a group rail class and is open to children ages 0-10. It is not a USDF/USEF class. Children must have a helmet and heeled boots to participate. There is no fee for this class, but the horse must be entered in the show and the parent/guardian must sign all release forms for the rider.
- Second Level Test 3 on Sunday (Class 217) offers a Dover Medal prize to the highest score of 60% or higher in the AA division.
- Opportunity Training Level Tests 1 & 2, and Opportunity First Level Tests 1 & 2 are classes made available for riders who are experimenting with dressage showing (USEF GR821). These entries must pay all other show related fees (office, grounds, and stabling, etc. **BUT** not USEF drug free), but the Opportunity classes do not require USEF/USDF memberships or nonmember fees for either horse or rider/owner/trainer or coach. Riders entering Opportunity classes may not cross enter into the rated/recognized classes but they may enter into Introductory classes which are not rated/recognized.

REFUNDS: Prior to closing date, all fees refunded except office fee. After the closing date, no refunds for any reason including Acts of God will be given. Drug, qualifying fees and facility fees will be refunded. No refunds on competition days. If wait listed entries cannot be accepted because of a full show, all fees will be refunded. Refunds will NOT be given for class cancellation due to severe weather, accident, or other emergency.

TIMES: The preferred method of notification for all entries is email, so please include a clearly readable email address with entry. It is the competitor's responsibility to confirm ride times on the day of the show.

AWARDS: Ribbons will be awarded first through sixth in each division. Awards to be given to First Place and High Point in all divisions for the each day of the show, but additional awards will be determined depending on amount of entries. Ties will be broken in accordance

with USEF DR123. In case of equality of points, the competitor with the highest marks received under General Impressions shall be declared the winner. When the scores for General Impressions are equal, the horses must remain tied.

STABLING: All stabling will be provided on site. Stalls will be assigned and a list posted in the event barn. Please indicate stabling group on your entry. You need to bring your own water buckets, bucket hangers, bridle & saddle racks, and manure removal equipment. \$40 per stall per day and includes one initial bag of shavings for your entire stay. Tack stalls available for \$25 per day. Additional bag of shavings is \$9 each. Hay is available for \$6 per bale, or you may provide your own. RV sites are in front of stalls, showers available on site.

Stabling Packages:

A: Show Package, Stabling or Tack for one night (July 28 or 29): \$40

B: Show Package, Stabling or Tack (Arrive July 28, Leave July 29): \$75

C: Additional Night/Day, Stabling or Tack (July 27 or/and July 30): \$25

**This fee includes schooling/facility use. There is no limit to how many extra days you may add to either end of the show.*

Please note: You must clean stall before leaving, but facility will strip it. No cleaning deposit. Tack stalls must be left clean.

FOOTING: The warm up arena has well maintained and watered footing and will be in the outdoor arena. The two dressage arenas are 20 x 60 and will be in the indoor arena and are well maintained and watered footing. Lunging area is available. Only horses with entries will be permitted in arenas. Numbers are required at all times when the horse is outside their stall.

CONCESSIONS: On grounds during show hours.

SMOKING AND PETS: No smoking on show grounds! Dog must be leashed at all times and owner is responsible for any damage or injury caused by the dog on the show grounds and are **NOT** allowed in buildings.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Livingston: Comfort Inn 406-222-4400, Rodeway Inn 406-222-6320, Quality Inn 406-222-0555, Super 8 406-222-7711. In addition, camping is available at Heart K. Pay with entry. RV hookups with electricity in front of outdoor stalls. There is plenty of dry-camping available.
