

Faith in Stained Glass

The Revd. Noel Carter writes:

Our churches are wonderful places to sit and reflect. I spent some time in St Paul's Church in Craig-y-Don at their recent Art, Craft and Music Fair on the Extravaganza weekend at the start of May. I was struck afresh by the wonderful East Window (pictured above) which strikingly chronicles the early history of the church.

On the centre panel the cross grows out of the `Tree of Life'. On either side of Christ on the cross stand Mary and John, the Beloved Disciple. Looking on from the left bottom panel are St Peter and St Paul and behind them we see two Bishops - St James the Apostle, the first Bishop of Jerusalem and St David, the first Bishop of Wales. The window has a real mission feel as it moves from the biblical figures central to the Good News of Jesus, to those who brought the Christian Faith to the British Isles. Those great Celtic saints, Columba and Aidan, who journeyed from Iona and Lindisfarne to bring Christianity to the North of these Islands. In the top right we see St Augustine and St Wilfred who brought the Christian Faith to the south of England. The story of the window finishes as you look at the lower right corner and see the martyrs - Stephen, St Alban and nearer to home St Winifred of Holywell. The window is truly inspirational as it chronicles the past, but it also points to the future. church grew as a result of the efforts and vision of just a small number of people, who were brave enough to tell other about Jesus. Our challenge is to follow in their footsteps.

The Revd Juliet Fraser - Juliet will be licensed as a Curate in the Aberconwy Mission Area at Esgobty in St Asaph on the 8th July and her first Sunday will be on the 15th July. During the Summer there will be opportunities to welcome Juliet to all the churches in our Mission Area. Juliet writes on page 5.


The Revd Juliet Fraser writes:

Well hello Aberconwy Mission Area! Thank you for this opportunity of introducing myself to you, prior to joining you all in July, to complete my Curacy and to join your ministry team. I am, I suppose a 'local' having been brought up in the Conwy area, as is my husband Mark, so we know that we are coming to a lovely part of the Diocese and to people who are well known for their warmth and welcome.

Although I was brought up as a Christian, and had played an active part in church life, my calling to ministry, however, did take me somewhat by surprise. There was no Damascus moment, just that gentle nudge which compels you to follow and tread the path that the Lord lays before your feet. Although I felt called to ordained ministry, I confidently followed the path, knowing that when I came to the place the Lord wanted me to be, I would know the ministry to which God was calling me.

The Theology for Life Course (formerly Exploring Faith)

Would you like to study theology?

Are you interested in exploring your vocation, training for a ministry or just want to find out more about how the insights of academic theology and lived-out faith might inform each other?

Fancy beginning a certificate, diploma or degree programme, or want to take your existing learning to the next level?

Theology for Life programme might be for you. We are setting up new small study groups and there will be groups you can join spread across the Diocese. Or why not set up your own group together in your church or Mission Area? We have an introductory morning at 10 am-12:30 pm at All Saints Church Southsea, Wrexham, LL11 5PG on Saturday 9th June where you can find out more about the course.

Theology for Life (Previously called Exploring Faith) is a programme of theological study undertaken in small groups meeting eight times a term and in Diocesan seminars twice a term. It is designed both to enable church members to deepen their understanding and discover the insights of academic study for themselves and to be one component of the training for those preparing for Reader, Pastor, Evangelist, Youth and Children's and Ordained ministries. It exists to help the whole church learn collaboratively together, valuing the insights that each person brings. A number of our students have begun the course as disciples, deepening their understanding, and have then gone on to reflect on their vocation and the roles they play in the church. Others have simply found that the course has enabled them to better understand their faith and the witness they have in daily life.

The course material is designed to be relevant to the life and faith of church members and is not 'ivory tower' theology with no connection to the real world. The number of angels on a pin-head is not on the syllabus. The course is also intended to stimulate, challenge and ask questions. It does not seek to give definite answers or enforce a particular dogmatic stance. It is open to, and enriched by, all believers of differing churchmanship and theological opinion.

The course is open to all and offers anyone who wishes the chance to study for a recognised University qualification, or perhaps to attend groups without doing assessed work. There is no minimum academic qualification needed to enrol and no age limit. The course will take approximately 6 hours a week (including group meetings and preparatory reading) for non-assessed students and 12+ hours for assessed students (including further reading and assignment work) and so a degree of commitment and dedication from each group member is required to benefit from taking part. You will need basic IT skills, such as being able to use websites, email and type up an essay.

It is designed for those who want to take part in serious (but also, fun, relevant and rewarding!) study and those who are training for licensed or ordained ministry or who are exploring their calling.


Maelgwn Choir Concert

New mural for St David's

A new kitchen facility was installed in the recent past at the rear of the church at St David's and has been a great addition to the facilities available for functions and the serving of refreshments after the services on Fridays and Sundays.

However it was always felt that the surrounding area was a little bare as the expanse of wall around the kitchen was plain painted walls. Everyone felt that something was needed to break up the bland area of wall but no one could be certain of what was needed or how to resolve the problem. Coincidently and at almost the same time, we came across an image which we felt was perfect for a mural - a country scene with the words of Psalm 23 entwined around the mountain, river and fields scenery - and we also became aware of a wall artist who could create the picture we had found on the wall.

We therefore commissioned Jonathon Lloyd from Kinmel Bay to paint the mural and he spent a week on a scaffold tower recreating the image which he has surrounded in a painted window frame in the same shape as that of the existing windows in the Church to give the feel of a view though a window. The end result is a stunning image which is eye catching from every part of the Church and has brightened up the rear of the building to achieve exactly what was required to complete the kitchen project.

We are so grateful to have funded the project with donations/legacy in memory of Ron Jones, Dorothy Evans and Bessie Royal and their names have been discretely included within the mural. We are also very grateful to Jonathon for his talented work. The mural was dedicated as part of the service on Easter Sunday which was a fitting conclusion to the kitchen project which has taken some rime to come to fruition.

St Paul's, Craig-y-Don

It's a church warden's job to process statistics, particularly at this time of year when we are busy sending off our annual returns to the Church in Wales central office.

But in among the data from the last year, one set of statistics in particular does stand out – the bank holiday weekend at the start of May. Here are a few of the numbers:

£1822 raised for church funds and other good causes

Church open to the public for 25 hours over three days

Estimated 500 people through the doors

It was a busy weekend with an art and craft exhibition, a brass band concert, a baptism and even a Sunday morning service in there somewhere. What the statistics can't record is the value to St Paul's of simply opening the doors and having people see that the place is open for business.

The weekend also saw the latest in the summer series of brass band concerts featuring Holywell Band raising money for their youth training programme and the St Paul's choral scholar fund. Takings and audience numbers were up on the first concert in April, though there's still work to do to try and develop these concerts and tell more people that they're happening. They take place on the first Saturday of the month at 7.30 pm, and admission is free with retiring collection.

Away from the statistics, we've welcomed Rev Ginny Burton as our new family and community officer. Rev Ginny is well known to people in the Mission Area as she was previously the priest at Glan Conwy until the end of last year.

She's already got stuck in to her new role by kicking off a new project at our church school, Ysgol Bodafon, where the children have begun learning about the stories from the bible through Lego and technology. We have been doing something similar with children from the after-school club at Springfield Day Nurseries across the road for the last year, but working with Ysgol Bodafon also allows us to connect with an older age group.

Dementia-friendly screenings at Theatr Colwyn



Mission Area Annual Easter Vestry Meeting

Chris Dearden reports:

Around 30 people were present at the Easter Vestry meeting, which Mission Area Leader the Revd. Noel Carter opened with prayer, asking everyone to think of what they can do to grow their bit of the church.

Ann Harty, Mission Area Treasurer, presented a cashflow summary of the central bank account, explaining that it hadn't been possible to get full sets of church accounts because of problems introducing new accounting software - a steep learning curve for everyone. expenses). Clergy expenses are now being paid by the Diocese, so will be added to the parish share from 2019. Noel Carter said that there would be

tough financial times ahead, as the Diocese has been running a deficit budget in recent years and has wiped out its reserves. This means that from 2019, there could be a large increase in the parish share or cutting the number of priests by 15. He stressed that the Diocese doesn't want to take either option, so is looking at other ways to balance the books.

Dilys Stone gave the Electoral Roll report. The roll has been completely re-done to reflect the fact that Aberconwy Mission Area is a new entity, and the forms also had a consent section to comply with new data protection laws. There were 317 on the roll at time of reporting, which is significantly down from previously, mainly because not everyone had yet returned forms.

All officers of the Mission Area were re-elected; Barry Ainge and Tesni Hadwin as Wardens, Ann

Harty as Treasurer, Mary Pritchard and Ann Milne as Secretaries. The Finance and Buildings committees will be meeting shortly and are due to meet around three times in the year.

Noel Carter reported on the challenges ahead; he said that the transition from parishes and benefices to mission areas had meant tough times for people across the Diocese. People were beginning to understand that a mission area was not just a simple administrative equivalent of a deanery, but was intended to help and promote growth in the church. He said that one of the challenges ahead was money - it currently costs £12/week for someone just to sit in our pews. In addition, some churches had struggled to use the new data development system for their financial reports.

But he said the greatest challenge was growth. Numbers were continuing to fall in some churches, though there are signs that growth is starting to happen around the Mission Area. Many people have been taking the "Leading Your Church Into Growth" course, and ideas were starting to flow from this. The

bishop has challenged all churches in the Diocese to grow by 10% in 2018 (though it was unclear how we quantify this). Noel Carter said that all churches are capable of growth, but we have to work for it.

He continued by saying that the Revd Ginny Burton had retired in 2017 and that had meant changes to service patterns in the Conwy Valley; the Revd Sarah Hildreth-Osborn was now due to be remaining on sick leave until July, and there would be continuing discussions with those churches affected to look at how we cover her absence.

Noel Carter concluded by saying that it was easy to get despondent, but there are huge grounds for confidence, and it was now up to us to move things forward. His three themes going ahead communications are important, and publicity is important..... but prayer is also essential.

He thanked everyone who has helped keep the Aberconwy Mission Area functioning during the year, from church and mission area officials to lay readers and retired clergy.
