## The Hint of new life

"Six days before the Passover Jesus came to Bethany, the home of Lazarus, whom he had raised from the dead." John 12: 1



With the raising of Lazarus from death, the religious authorities find reason to begin the final plot against Jesus. Mary understands that Jesus is to die, and anoints him with costly nard, as if for burial. She wipes his feet with her hair.

Jesus understands her extravagant gesture. It is as if a wordless conversation of breathtaking intimacy has taken place between them. Mary says, "I know." And Jesus acknowledges - "I know that you know." Mary, relieved, sighs, "Now I know that you know that I know."

As you read this we are approaching the end of Lent. And this story, that will be heard on Fifth Sunday in Lent, offers hints of the new life about to unfold.

I was asked to find out the average Sunday attendance figures for our Mission Area Churches in 2018, so they could be compared to figures from 2017. They showed that two churches had grown in numbers, one church had stayed the same and that seven churches had declined in attendance. Overall, church attendance in the Mission Area had declined by about 5%. This, I think is misleading. Sunday attendance is declining year on year in both Wales and England. However, the experience of many of our churches is that the number of people involved in church activities outside Sundays is growing. The attendance at mid-week services has increased and we are discovering that being a seven day a week church is what it us all about. These are the hints of new life that point to the resurrection of the Church.

I pray for this new life to arise in you and in me and all our churches.

## St Ffraid's, Glan Conwy

St Ffraid's Church Committee recently held a very successful Gift Day. A letter and Gift Aid envelope was hand delivered by members of the Fundraising Team to every household in the village. A "drop-off" point for donations was set up in the village shop and the team also held an Open Morning serving complimentary refreshments in St Ffraid's Church on 2<sup>nd</sup> February which attracted sixty parishioners into the church during the morning. We have had a social media campaign keeping the appeal fresh and enabling us to update parishioners on progress. To date £5212 has been received in individual donations and a further £5000 has been donated by Glan Conwy Community Council. Further events are planned by the Golf Society, the Guides and Brownies and local Filmmakers which will add to the final total raised.

The Fundraising Team will continue with their successful monthly Bingo sessions held on the

first Thursday of each month in Church House throughout 2019. The evening has a healthy attendance of around 40 players who enjoy this social evening. Complimentary refreshments are served and players entertained by the caller lan Morris. £290 was raised at the February session.

Llansanffraid Glan Conwy Pantomime Group once again had a good response to their annual pantomime in January. This year the group presented "Jack and the Beanstalk" for four sell out performances in Church House. The pantomime is written by James Berry a member of St Ffraid's and performed by a cast aged from four years upwards. £2500 was raised for St Ffraid's Church from the pantomime by the group.
