

Celebrating the gift of the Holy Spirit

The Revd Noel Carter writes:

At Pentecost Christians celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit. It is celebrated on the Sunday fifty days after Easter and ten days after Ascension Day. Jesus had promised his followers that, although they would not see him after his Ascension, they would receive the Holy Spirit to guide and inspire them.



The Acts of the Apostles describes how the crowds gathered in Jerusalem – representing many nationalities and speaking many languages – were able to hear the disciples preaching in their own language: *'When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting.'* Acts 2, verse 2

Many churches set aside the ten days between Ascension and Pentecost as a special time of prayer for the gift of the Holy Spirit. **'Thy Kingdom Come'** – the global wave of prayer

established in 2016 following an invitation from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York – has seen millions of Christians across denominations and the world joining together to pray for more people to come to know Jesus. During the 10 days of **'Thy Kingdom Come'**, it is hoped that everyone who takes part will

Come to realise that every aspect of their life is the stuff of prayer

After the very first Ascension Day the disciples gathered, constantly devoting themselves to prayer while they waited for the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Like them, our reliance on the gift of the Holy Spirit is total – on our own we can do nothing.

Through the centuries Christians have gathered at this time to pray for the coming of the Holy Spirit. Communities have dedicated the days between Ascension and Pentecost to pray **'Come Holy Spirit'**. We are praying that the Spirit will inspire and equip us to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with our friends, families and our communities. It is our prayer that those who have not yet heard the Good News of Jesus Christ and his love for the world will hear it for themselves, and respond and follow Him. On **Ascension Day Thursday 30th May** there will be a service to launch 10 days of Prayer for the coming of the Holy Spirit into the life of the Mission Area. This Special service of Prayer and Praise will take place in **St Hilary's, Llanrhos at 7.30 pm**. I look forward to seeing you there!

St Grwst's Update

Work will begin in the summer on the almost £1m refurbishment of St Grwst's Church in Llanrwst. The redevelopment will create a flexible and welcoming space for both the community and visitors, provide new disabled access and carry out vital repairs to the buildings. The 17th century Gwydir Chapel, which is built on the side of the ancient church and houses the coffin of Llywelyn the Great, will be restored and its historical significance celebrated.

The church will be temporarily closed for almost a year for this work to be undertaken. During the closure, services will continue at Church House, Watling Street: Every Sunday Bilingual Holy Eucharist at 4 pm, and on the 2nd and 4th Sunday Morning Prayer in Welsh at 9.30 am. 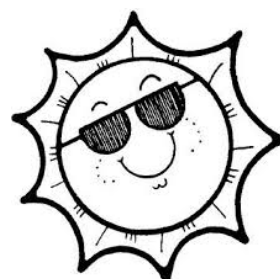

St Pauls has been delighted that children from Ysgol Bodafon are growing in number, and in participation at the Family Services, held on the second Sunday of each month at 4 pm. A short and interactive service, it is filled with variety, food and fun – and the parents all enjoy it too! Most of all, it is a great opportunity to show off the newly created prayer boxes from each of the classes, with the prayers of the children being read out by a member of the school. A fine example of them showing off the God-given talents placed in each child.

The next family service falls on **Pentecost Sunday, June 9th**, which is the day Christians celebrate the Holy Spirit falling upon the disciples of Jesus. Jesus had promised the disciples that once He had left them, He would send them the Holy Spirit as a Helper and a Guide - an incredible promise that, when He would no longer be physically among them the same Spirit that was with Jesus on earth would come to guide the disciples on the way of truth. 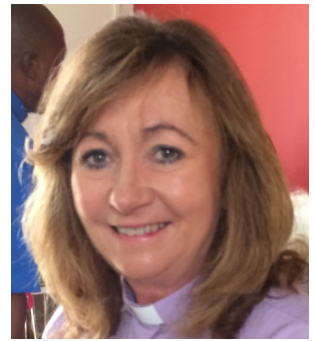
The Revd Juliet Fraser writes:

The choir wasn't cut off in the middle. Maybe someone is keeping an eye on St Paul's after all?

FAIR TRADE MASNACH DEG



People came from groups in Mold, Holywell, Abergele, Conwy and Bangor to a recent meeting with Aileen from Fair Trade Wales. They got a broader understanding of Fair Trade including the Fairtrade Foundation and certification, discussing how to take their groups forward, recruiting and inspiring new members, finding out about FT in Africa because of Wales' links there, hearing about information and resources to encourage shops and the issue of the increasing number of businesses in the 'ethical market' but not using Fairtrade products.

Aileen produced a Review last year for the Welsh Government (soon to be published, bi-lingually). An online survey found that people felt proud that Wales is a FT nation, it is morally right, supporting justice and fairness and fits with Wales' identity, but there is still more to do. Future priorities include more businesses involved in promoting and using FT, and there were many other headings including education and Government support.

FT Wales grew from a grassroots movement, and is now supported by the Welsh Government as part of HUB Cymru Africa funding, currently in year one of a 3 year cycle. It plans to support, grow and promote Fair Trade in Wales, and has started a university network to encourage them to engage more, with a similar pilot scheme for Local Government. They do not have the resources to work with businesses - this is a Government responsibility - and they are no longer funded to work in schools. They have spoken to almost half of the National Assembly members about the Living Incomes Campaign, and are arranging the 13th International Fair Trade Towns Conference in Cardiff in October.

Housing Justice

Housing Justice Cymru is the Welsh arm of Housing Justice, whose mission is to mobilise Christian action on homelessness and housing need through love, justice, advocacy and nurture.

The St Asaph Diocesan annual appeal for 2019 will be the Wrexham Night Shelter. The project, set up by **Housing Justice Cymru** and supported by the **Diocese of St Asaph**, is being run in partnership with Wrexham Borough Council and other agencies working with those who are homeless in the town.

Sarah Wheat, Diocesan Engagement Officer seconded to Housing Justice Cymru, was speaker at the **St Asaph Diocesan Mothers' Union** Spring Council and talked about what happened over ten weeks between January and March 2019, the first winter.

Seven different churches across Wrexham offered their church or hall as a venue for the night shelter - one night, every week for ten weeks. 200 volunteers from church and community groups in the town donated 3950 hours of their time over the 69 nights.

Teams of trained volunteers welcomed the ten guests every night, offering a safe environment, respect, clean bed, a hot meal and breakfast; providing hospitality and continuity in the hope that this stability would be a chance to focus on other issues and engage with agencies to help them out of homelessness.

In all 18 people were supported by the project. The age range 21-63 years. Nine people moved into permanent accommodation.

The Mothers' Union has supported the 2019 project with a donation of new bedding and has promised further support for 2020.

By making a donation to the Diocesan Offering Appeal for 2019, parishes in the diocese will be able to support this very worthwhile project.

Llandudno Youth for Christ

is celebrating ten years since it started. Supported by members of local churches, the work among local teenagers has quietly and steadily grown.

Tim Gough has completed 8 years here as youth worker and has recently written a book on Church Youth work, 'Youthwork Rebooted.' Now based at Community Centre Ty Llewelyn near Llandudno Hospital, Tim has built up a team of voluntary helpers. He regularly takes assemblies and RE lessons at Ysgol John Bright, with a weekly lunch time voluntary Christian club with a regular attendance of thirty or so. The Sunday night Redefine sees about twenty coming for contemporary worship and Bible teaching. You can keep up to date on Facebook by following Llandudno Youth for Christ and visiting their website.

Tim's helper Cory Finch, is taking a lunchtime Club at Ysgol Aberconwy as well as a midweek new 'Shuffle and Shake' Club in Colwyn Bay, where young people can play board games. The plan was always to reach out from Llandudno.

There is a monthly ecumenical Prayer Meeting on the fourth Sunday evening at 7 p.m. at Ty Llewelyn open to all church members.

We can look back over ten years with much thanksgiving. Please pray for the young people of Llandudno in these challenging times. Llandudno Youth for Christ exists to serve all the churches.

We have been arranging for refugees from South Sudan, Daniel Penny, 15, and brothers Richard, 11, Joseph, 9, sister Joy, 7, and cousins Joy and Namaku, to be going on a Uganda Scripture Union Activity at Mukono, to a Centre belonging to Noah's Ark Ministries. Aunt Zereda and big sister Vickie, 21, will be going to support Joseph, who is spina bifida, and in a wheelchair. I am grateful to those who are helping with sponsorship.

The whole concept of going away on a little holiday is unknown for most children living in situations of poverty. Please pray that all the children may have a very happy, safe time, and for the Scripture Union organisers. Pray that all the children will be strengthened spiritually, and helped to follow Jesus.

Because of the ongoing troubles and lack of education, and because they have sponsors, these children are away from home in South Sudan 10 months of the year, so please pray for their parents, and their dad Archbishop Samuel in particular.

Please remember Uncle Esau Penny with the logistics of getting everyone to Mukono! And remember also the vast, vast numbers of refugees from South Sudan in camps in northern Uganda. The instability continues.
