WATER WEDNESDAYS

As you know, Brackenhurst
Primary School was part of a drive
last week to get water to Cape
Town in order for them to survive
the drought. As a result we have
decided to go ahead with 'Water Wednesdays'
where each child can bring sealed water for
human consumption or bottles of tap water for
animals.

The tap water can be brought in 2 litre cold drink bottles and the "sealed" water in 5 litre containers. The learners bringing bottles of water will then be allowed to wear civvies.

This initiative will be run in conjunction with the Panorama Flea Market, the DA, Gift of the Givers and Water King. They will collect the bottles of water from the schools and arrange to have them delivered.

We would like to run **'Water Wednesdays'** for the duration of February.

PARENT'S CORNER

BACK TO SCHOOL BLUES: HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD WITH SHYNESS

In January thousands of young children start or return to school.

For most young people this is a time of high excitement and energy. The long holidays have come to an end and they are looking forward to seeing old friends, making new ones and being a grade higher.

But the excitement is often tinged with a hint of trepidation – "who will be in my class," "will they still like me," "what teachers will I get?" For some young people these worries can dominate their life.

Shyness is a personality characteristic that exists across the community. When shyness becomes very severe and starts to affect a person's life, it can be diagnosed as "social anxiety disorder."

Socially anxious young people worry excessively about what others think of them and how they come across. They are very self-conscious and often freeze or become confused when they are the focus of attention.

Going back to school is the stuff of nightmares for these children. Some of the hardest experiences for a socially anxious young person will be found at school; meeting new children, talking to authority figures, standing in front of a

group, getting into trouble and negotiating the hierarchies of the playground.

Shy children can make good friendships, but usually have fewer friends than other children. They are also more likely to be the targets of bullying. Many of these young children will be terrified at the prospect of going to school and the first few weeks will be especially hard.

How can you help your child?

Shy young people can be taught to think more realistically about the things that worry them. "They will think I'm an idiot if I wear that" can be challenged by asking "what would you think of someone wearing it?" "Everyone is staring at me" can be challenged by getting the child to look around and count how many people are actually looking.

Shy young children should also be challenged to gently and gradually face their fears. For example, for a young child who is scared to speak to others, they could be challenged to speak to one or two "safer" children every day for the next week.

Finally, if you find that you, as a parent, have a tendency to jump in and regularly help your child, try to get into the habit of asking yourself, "what would happen if I held back for a few minutes?"
