



SCHOOL FEES 2019

At the Annual General Meeting held on 31 October 2019, the school fees for 2019 were agreed upon as follows:

School fees 2019 = R13 882,00 School fees are payable as follows: OPTION A: R11 800,00 (payable by 31 March 2019 - (15% discount) OPTION B: (Debit Order) 11 equal monthly payments - R1 262,00 per month, 1 February - 1 December 2019 **OPTION C:** Electronic transfer. Payment of R1 262,00 per month. Copy of proof of any payment by electronic transfer must be submitted to the bursar, Mrs Linda Joubert.

E-LEARNING LEVY

At the Annual General Meeting held on 31 October 2018, a resolution was passed regarding the E-Learning levies. The levies for 2019 are as follows:

E-Learning Levy for Grades 4 - 7 is R350,00. If we do not receive this levy, we will not be able to load the software onto your child's tablet and they will continue working from hard copy text books.


An annual levy of R250,00 per child for learners Grade 1 - 3 should be paid before end January 2019. This will cover the cost of the trolley solution with tablets we have purchased for our Foundation Phase learners.

IT MUST BE A SEPARATE PAYMENT. IF YOU PUT THE PAYMENT THROUGH WITH SCHOOL FEES IT WILL NOT BE TRANSFERRED TO E-LEVY.

PARENTS CORNER

"Play with me, not your cellphones!" A 7-year-old 'organised' a march against parents on smartphones.

"We are here, we are raising our voices because you're always staring at your phones!" 7-year-old Emil Rustige was so tired of competing with his father's smartphone for attention that the little boy decided a protest was in order.

Kids in the German city of Hamburg took to the streets to demand that their parents put down their phones.

"Play with me, not your cell phones!" "Now it's our turn, switch on flight mode!"

Just two of the slogans that rang loud and clear at one of the most unique protests you'll probably ever hear about.

This September, parents and children took to the streets of Hamburg, Germany, in protest of what most regards as another limb: smartphones.

It was put into motion by a 7-year-old child, Emil Rustige, who had had just about enough of being ignored in the name of a digital device.

"Emil is blaming me for using my phone. The moment he is around and communicating with me I am absent and doing something totally different," explained Martin Rustige, Emil's father who assisted his son with organising the legal protest after the boy told his father how ignored he felt.

Witnessing his aunt in political action months earlier had inspired Emil to try his hand at putting together a march of his own, and with the help of his parents, promoted the protest online.

The family quickly found supporters, with just over 400 people expressing interest in joining the march online, and 150 parents and children attending on the day, placards and all.

"We are here, we are raising our voices because you're always staring at your phones!"

"I hope that after the demonstration people will spend less time on their phones," announced the little revolutionary over speakerphone. Given what we know about how detrimental the overuse of smartphones are, the little boy has hit the nail right on the head.

Ever had an accident while distracted by your smartphone? Ever realised your child is trying to open up to you but you're too engrossed to listen?


