



Yacht Survey Agreement

- The Survey Results Will Be Transmitted Only To The Person Or Persons Authorizing And Making Payment.
- It Is Recommended That All Sailboat Rigging Be Inspected By A Qualified Rigger. The Surveyor In Attendance Will Not Ascend The Mast. Sailboat Surveys Will Be Performed At Deck Level Only.
- The Survey Inspection Is Made Of All Parts Of The Yacht That Are Accessible Without Disassembly. The Surveyor Assumes No Responsibility For Any Defects Not Found In Non-Accessible Areas And Is Not Responsible For Conditions Subsequently Arising.
- A Determination Will Be Made Of The Condition And Safety Of All Accessible Parts.
- A "Fair Market And Replacement Value" Of The Yacht Can Be Established, If Necessary.
- Recommendations Will Be Included In All Surveys.
- The Survey Will Report If The Yacht Is Sound For Its Intended Use.
- It Is Recommended That All Gasoline And Diesel Engines, Gears And Pumps, Heat Exchangers, Coolers, Etc. Be Inspected By A Qualified Engine Surveyor.
- It Is Recommended That A Sea Trial Be Performed And The Yacht Be Hauled Out For Inspection Of The Wetted Surface Area Of The Hull And All Underwater Machinery.
- Laboratory Oil Analysis Is Available, However It Is Understood That Oil Samples Are Not Designed To Replace A Full Engine Survey.
- The Report Will Be Prepared After A Thorough Visual And Hands On Inspection Of The Hull, Rigging, Hardware, Systems And Equipment. The Report Will Be Submitted In Good Faith, Without Prejudice And Constitutes A Description Of The Condition Of The Yacht At The Time Of The Survey.
- The Report Will Not Express Or Imply Warrant Or Guarantee The Condition Of The Yacht.
- In No Event Shall The Legal Liability Of The Surveyor Exceed The Fee Paid For This Survey Report, Regardless Of Claims Or Suits And Regardless Of Whether Under Theory Of Tort, Contract, Products Liability, Admiralty, Or Otherwise.
- The Mandatory Standards Promulgated By The United States Coast Guard (Uscg), Under The Authority Of Title 46 United States Code; Title 33 And Title 46, Code Of Federal Regulations (Cfr), The Voluntary Standards And Recommended Practices Developed By The American Boat And Yacht Council (Abyc) And The National Fire Protection Association (Nfpa) Will Be Used As Guidelines In The Conduct Of This Survey.
