"APATHY"

"Apathy, ap-a-the, n. pl. apathies. [L.apathia, Gr. apatheia, apathes, without feeling, a, no, and pathes, suffering.] Want of feeling; privation of passion, emotion, or excitement; insensibility; indifference. (Webster, pg. 47).

Indifferent, in-dif-fer-ent, in-dif-fer-ent, a. [L. indifferens, indifferentis.] Without interest or concern; not caring; apathetic; not making a difference either way; of no significance; mediocre; neither good or bad; impartial or undiased; biol. not differentiated. (Webster, pg. 489).

Since the word "apathy" doesn't appear in the Bible, we have used one of its synonyms, (indifference), to help us define and understand the term. This also enables us to recognize its presence in some passages, although it may not be specifically mentioned in the text.

Sometimes people are apathetic to a particular message. Those of our Lord's own country were apathetic to th gospel message, "Now He did not do many mighty works there because of their unbelief" (Matthew 13:58). Some still display this same disposition toward the gospel today.

Others are apathetic to the benevolent needs of their neighbors. It is written of the priest and Levite, who through apathy, ignored the need of their neighbor and, "...passed by on the other side" (Luke 10:31-32). Are we sometimes guilty of the same?

Occasionally, some are even apathetic in attendance. For some unexplained reason, Thomas, one of the twelve, was absent when the Lord appeared to the disciples on the first day of the week to break bread with them, "Now Thomas, called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came" (John 20:24).

Apathy will eventually cost many their soul.
