I also notice that we had a great group stay for the Agape meal on Sunday. It was certainly a beautiful day for fellowship and encouragement. It is also a blessing to be able to share such time with visitors. Yet another blessing God gives us all to be together and to share our faith.

I thought I would give you a quick update on the good work in Ghana. So far the school continues to do well and is accomplishing the purpose for which it was established. As you remember, we started with 5 students in this intake. After the first week, we were able to pick up another student which brought us to 6 total. However, one of our original students was unable to continue his studies due to health issues. Please keep brother Amos in your prayers in connections to his health. We sure are sorry to lose this good brother at the school, but pray he will continue to be faithful and stand strong for the Lord.

Another exciting part of the work in Ghana is the desire of so many young men to train and to grow in their knowledge of the teaching of Christ. A lot of these men are present in the University, but want to study God's Word. They have continued to plead with the faculty at the school to teach some courses on Saturday, so they can learn more about God and grow as servants in His Kingdom. Because of this interest, brother Williams and James are working on starting a Saturday program to meet the need of these brethren. Hopefully, this might also encourage many of these young men to consider coming to our full time school in the near future. Please pray for these good efforts and the great work that continues to take place in Ghana.

Well, I hope you have a great day and I look forward to seeing you at services this evening. Brethren, remember God is good and those who serve Him faithful will always be rewarded. God bless!

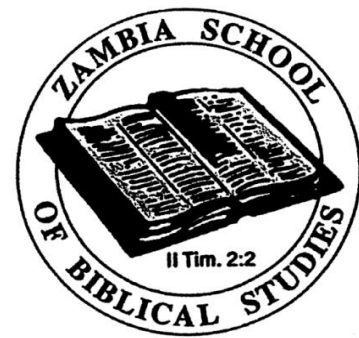
