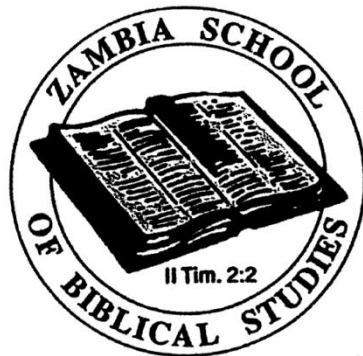

We have a large investment in Uganda in souls and property and for the need of training faithful gospel preachers. My funds for taking this journey are supplied by faithful brethren throughout the United States separate and apart from this congregation.

ELDERS' CORNER:

Our deepest sympathy is extended to the Bob Hyde family over the death of his father, Paul Hyde. Our prayers are offered on behalf of the family over the loss of a loved one during this difficult time.

This past Sunday, we had 30 men present at our Elders/Men's Meeting. First, we would like to thank you for the loving support of those who came but not only them, but for the congregation as a whole. We would like to give you a summary of the things discussed. You are most welcome to contact us about any of the matters discussed. We would like to receive your input.

1. The repair of the baptistry, the broken window that resulted from a break-in, and the TV Production cost for last year have all been covered through our church account. This is due to the fact that the congregation has been giving regularly above our weekly budget during the last few months of 2018 and in 2019. Thank you so much for your faithfulness in meeting the needs of the congregation.

2. The van has been broken into several times in the last few months. Measures are being taken to fix this problem.

3. Changes are being made in our class schedules for our Adults. Beginning the last Sunday of this month a new class in the Fellowship Room will begin on Sunday mornings with brother Brent Green as the teacher. We are hoping to have more variety in our teaching program to meet the needs of the congregation.

4. We also discussed our security system and certain changes will be made to secure our building in the near future.

5. VBS was discussed and consideration is given to changing the date from right before school starts to sometime in June or July.

6. A lengthy discussion was held on the changing of our Sunday evening service times. As you know, this past year we had a change in service times on every fifth Sunday. Some have suggested we do it every month on the last Sunday of the month and others suggested we just make the change for every Sunday.

7. A major portion of the meeting was used in discussing the immediate need for the replacement of our roof and the need for renovating the entire building.

8. An announcement was made that one of our brothers will be placed before the congregation very soon to be considered as an elder of this congregation. The whole process will begin and hopefully completed in March.

We had a great meeting. I know we all want to do what we can for the furtherance of the Kingdom here in Springfield and around the world. We would appreciate signed, written responses with any input you have concerning the items listed above. Then we will consider your comments and get back with you.

We love you all and pray that we all can maintain the unity in the body that our Lord desires of us. Seeing you all at all our services is our prayer.
