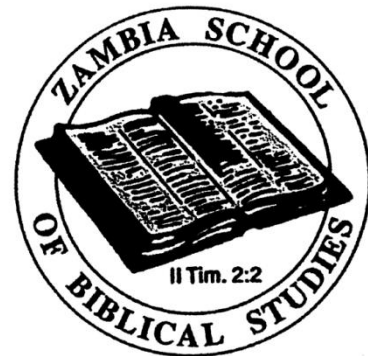

As I mentioned last week, we also need to send brother Samson home to Kenya so he can collect his wife and youngest child to come and to stay with him in Ghana. Brother Samson has been such a blessing to our work in Ghana and has really helped stabilize our school and our teaching staff there while we wait for other teachers to be ready to help out. Thanks again to the elders for allowing us to use this 5th Sunday contribution for Ghana. We are hoping to raise at least \$2000 on our 5th Sunday to help brother Samson go home and get his family. Thank you all in advance for considering the needs in Ghana and helping with these important needs in the work. Keep the good work in Ghana, as well as Uganda and Zambia in your prayers. May we all continue to do our part to spread the gospel throughout this world.

I look forward to seeing you all tonight. Also, let's make sure to be present Sunday, ready to give God our very best. Oh, what a blessing our worship and praise to God is. Furthermore, what an encouragement it is to us all to approach our Father's throne to glorify Him! May God bless us all in our faithful service!
