

Also, the breeze which we have had most of the time we have been here has stopped the last few days, which makes it feel even hotter. Anyway, we didn't melt and had a great time of worship and fellowship together.

We leave Zambia on Wednesday and begin our long travels home. We will be home on Thursday. I look forward to seeing you all next Sunday.
