It's All in the Questions You Ask or Don't Ask Mark 9:30-35

Background information:

- The unasked question and the unanswered answered question are critical components of today's lesson because tell us something about the group of men who are following Jesus.
- Although this isn't the first time that Jesus predicts his death, Jesus' message confuses the Twelve Disciples.
- Jesus both personifies a type of leadership and teaches about a type of leadership that doesn't fit into the Twelve Disciples' expectations because it suggests that serving and/or giving is the mark of a Godly leader.

Therefore, what can members of our fellowship community do to free themselves and others from this Spirit of Fear that sometimes paralyzes the faithful?

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
