2)	Have you ever desperately wanted something good for someone in your life yet still
	allowed them to make choices that invited bad into their life? If so, why didn't you
	force the person to make good and right choices?
Into th	ne Text
1)	If the Good News (or Gospel) contains God's power for salvation, do believers who
	refuse to share the Good News, do a disservice to people who haven't heard about
	Jesus yet? Why do you feel this way?
2)	In previous Bible Studies in this series, we learned how God offers people different ways
	to get to know God. How do all of these opportunities show that God's doing God's part
	to make God known to people who haven't heard about Jesus?

3)	Do you think God is being mean and vindictive by allowing people who haven't accepted
	the message of salvation to go to hell?
4)	Have you ever witness someone who isn't a Christian reveal that they know something

	did what you witness reinforce what today's lesson says about people knowing God but
	rejecting what has been revealed? If so, how so?
5)	Does it bother you to think that people who haven't heard the Good News will still be
	held responsible for not accepting Jesus Christ as Savior? If so, what will you do to
	spread the news?
