Our Building and Land: We are delighted to report that the west side of the Church roof has been replaced and the non-carpeted parts of church floor will be replaced by the end of this month. Further, thanks to the generosity of the Twiss Family, plans are in place to pave the parking lot, in memory of Claude and Francis Twiss.

The final Ash Tree in the cemetery has succumbed to the Ash beetle, and will be removed in the fall; We will be replacing the four trees that we have lost, and are offering the opportunity for parishioners to donate the cost of a tree (or part of the cost) in memory of a loved one.

Finances: Our income from collection is still down, and we are still showing expenses exceeding income. However, on the brighter side, our deficit is less than budgeted, due to increased rental income and cost control. But it is still a deficit and we need to increase income.

Rectory: There has been significant work done on the Rectory and its grounds this year. Replacement of sewer pipes necessitated landscaping and repairs to the front steps and railings; a new garage door was installed and the water heater has been replaced. The roof will be replaced and the driveway resurfaced before winter. Grateful thanks to Bonnie Powell who has so capably organized and managed all this much needed maintenance
