We will be collecting to help a Syrian refugee family living in Milton, father (Michael), mother (Talar), daughter (Marita, aged 9) and son (Abraham, aged 7 months). They are living in a basement apartment and are very grateful for our offer to help. They have been able to buy warm jackets and snowsuits for the children, but the parents still need warm jackets (men's large, woman's' medium) and they need bedding. We already have one offer of bedding. Apart from that, the best help would be gift cards, preferably Walmart, where they can buy what they need, while retaining their dignity. Michael was very concerned that, in asking for bedding and warm coats they were asking for too much!!

Gift's for this family should be brought to the Church by December 17th, after which we will arrange for them to be delivered to Michael, Talar, Marita and Abraham.

It is our sincere hope that you, the generous people at St. George's, will see this not just as a Christmas project, but as an ongoing ministry where we show the face of Christ to this family. Blessing for all you do.
