Dirty Little Secrets

I recently had to change my power antenna on the GT. This involved removing the bolted-in panel behind the right front wheel. The five or so bolts didn't want to come out easily and I had to hit them with Kroil. Eventually I got the inner panel off although I could not remove the lower most fastener. The panel just broke away there from the fastener. This should have told me something. Getting the antenna out was not too difficult. No doubt about it – the old antenna could not be saved (I tried). I was able to find a replacement at O'Reilly's.

The area behind the wheel was a time capsule of all those trips to the beach. I think I removed more than a starbucks coffee cup of damp, somewhat cemented fine sand. I didn't taste it for salt but imagine that it had a lot. The sand was blocking drainage and laying up against the inner steel fender and outer fender. This is the textbook description of the corrosion incubator on a lot of british cars. I may have caught mine in time – will see. Eventually this would have led to a rust through of the fender and damage to the rocker. I imagine a lot of the A's and B's have this ticking timebomb. If you've never removed the panel – I suggest you do so...

Last Month I posed the question – Whats in your boot? I did get two responses and want to thank the two members that found time to take a look and get back to me. I am going to call them Car A and Car B (one of the cars is a T-modified and the other is a BGT):

Car A – Spare tire, scissor jack and wood block (to get jack under front cross-member), mechanics tool kit, VOM & Tack / Dwell meters, timing light, jumper wires with alligator clips, tire tube, spoons,patch kit, air pump inflator with battery clips, jumper cables, brake fluid, motor oil, fuel pump, pump parts (diaphragm, point set), carb float, fan belt, generator brushes, coil, distributor plate with points and condenser, rotor, spark plugs, heater valve & gasket, hose plug and hose clamps – whew!

Car B - Fire extinguish, tire and jack, wheel wrench and hammer, oil and brake fluid, fan belt, synch carb, carb tool set, multi meter, continuity light, windshield wiper blades, grose jets, light bulbs, fuses, 5 feet of wire, duc & electric tape baskets goop, tools, fuel pump small square replacement, fuel pump original, MGB repair book, Moss cat and phone number, spare electronic distributor, heater value and gasket, starter relay, brake hose, fuel lines all, brake light sw, radiator hoses, flasher relay, coil, dist cap and rotor, oil line, generator, adjustable freeze plug, windex, and detail stuff with cloths and tooth brush – whew again!

Then there was my list (from the B roadster) - Tire, jack (scissors) and tire iron, oil (one quart 20w50), coolant and hydraulic oil (DOT 4), coil, fuel pump, hoses including the special branched hose from the water pump, tools including wrenches, pliers, screwdriver, sockets & ratchet, strip ties – I usually pack these before a tour, duct tape & electrical tape, bailing wire, swiss army knife, wax & car cleaning stuff and rags, a spare MGB manual, nuts & bolts (7/16 & ½ head size), tonneau & car cover (for overnight trips)

Both owners clearly hit the road prepared (they make my list of stuff seem like a leap of faith). Clearly there is some commonality but I'll let you make the links... There are probably some stories that go along with the lists (there has to be). Thanks again for the two owners that got back to me.







