#### NCCC update continued from last month

<u>Business Manager</u> – the 2017 NCCC insurance FAQ has been updated. You can find this on the NCCC website under Insurance – FAQ

<u>Director of Publications</u> – The NCCC display at the NCM has been updated. Next to be updated is the NCCC video that is next to the display.

<u>Director of IT</u> – The results of the 2017 website contest were announced. The top three Clubs were presented with place Cowtown Vettes.

<u>Parliamentarian</u> – The results of the 2017 Newsletter contest were announced. The top three Clubs were presented with awards at the 2017 convention. In first place Nashville CC, second place Corvette Club of Iowa and third place Cowtown Vettes. Cathy would like to encourage more clubs enter this competition.

<u>IT</u> – Presidents message is now being delivered to 11,200 email addresses valid in the NCCC database. Prepare for soft copies of renewal cards, this is in place and ready for renewal to start. The NCCC website will be moving the first week in January so you will not be able access during this week. Members on password will change beginning of the year.

**NCM Ambassador** – The Motorsports Park was home of 77 sanctioned events in 2017 plus the Bowling Green convention events. The recent "American Sports Car" magazine listed about 1000 of the NCM's donors for the past 12 months, NCCC Clubs, Regions and individual members are prominent on that list starting at \$100. We make up about, membership packets in each Museum delivery resulting in hundreds of new members. With the NCCC Membership support, the NCM is a permanent partner with NCCC.

#### **EAST OHIO REGION REPORT**

There were two Regional offices up for election both offices were unopposed so the Secretary cast one vote. Your RE is Terry Muich and Treasurer Peggy Stephens for the next two years.

<u>Competition</u> – The Regional event at the NCM was a success with a profit of \$3,000. Regional number list has been updated. Reminder at the Regional meeting in December Clubs will be bidding for their sanctions for 2018. (Tiretown will be 5<sup>th</sup> to bid). The Regional registration form is being updated. Registration form needs to show your name as it is registered with NCCC. Reminder that when you are running an autocross, if you are unable to complete the event or change classes you need to let a worker know so they can let timing know of the change.

<u>Hall of Fame</u> - Nominations for East Ohio Hall of Fame need to be submitted by November 17<sup>th</sup>. The form and the guidelines are on the EOR website.

<u>The EOR Memorial</u> - Collected \$5,370, cost of the monument was \$5,000. The balance went toward paying for the podium, chair rental and other misc. cost at the ceremony.

<u>Treasurer</u> - Proposal made to add a separate budget for Secretary and Treasurer since in the past the same person held these offices. This was approved. I have a copy of the Treasurer report dated 9/23/2017 and the proposed budget for 2018 if anyone would like to see them let me know.

#### By-Law Changes

There were 5 By-Law changes. The first and second changes were only one word; the third was on page 6 section 1 Dropping Competition Program Director since this position has not been used for several years. In Section D paragraph 5 – under Hall of Fame. Once placed on the ballot, the nominee will remain on the ballot for two consecutive years. If not elected to the Hall of Fame, a new nomination form will have to be filled out for the person to be placed on the ballot again. They can be re-nominated after being off the ballot for two (2) years.

Newer Member Jackie Houk asked Lynn Burdick to come and talk about a charity group called ACCESS - I have included information from Jackie about ACCESS for this newsletter. I hope that each member will accept the challenge of purchasing pillows for ACCESS. I know that several members brought pillows to Jackie at the Memorial last weekend at the Western Reserve Cemetery. I hope that the rest of us will bring pillows to be donated to ACCESS on Monday November 6, when we meet at the Venue on Tallmadge Circle and Rt. 91 (South Ave.) Dinner that evening will be ordered from Firehouse Grill.

"ACCESS is a local homeless shelter that has a waiting list of over 1,000 women in the Summit County area. Each woman is given a chance to start her life over by going through the program. The women are taken to the local Goodwill to select a professional business suit to wear and then the women attend a week of classes on how to present themselves, answer questions, proper handshakes and how to show the employer that they would be an asset to their company for employment. If they show up every day on time to work and prove that they want to work, after one month ACCESS will contact a local landlord for a reduced price place to live.

Each woman, when entering the program is given a pillow, XL Twin Sheet set and an XL Twin Blanket. The supply for these items are endless, as they take these items when entering and leaving the program. I am requesting that each of you to please bring one new item per person to the November 6 meeting. My wish is to fill my car to the top with new pillows and drive them to ACCESS." 

#### Membership Card Printing



#### Google Chrome:




- 1) Click on the three dots in the upper right-hand corner and select Print.

There will also be special awards for each of the best costumes women/girls and men/boys.




