

Christians today can apply the principle of Isaiah 40:31 by trusting in God's sovereignty and waiting faithfully for Him. Many of us dread waiting, but through the prophet Isaiah, the Lord tells us that waiting can actually be a good thing. Choosing to "wait upon

the Lord" or viewed another way, to serve Him -- yields far more satisfying results. This choice also helps us to remember that because our Heavenly Father's greatest desire is to bless His children, He will not only give us what we need, He'll also give it at the time that is best for us.

God in His grace will provide power, strength, and courage to the weary, weak, and downtrodden when they are willing to be patient and wait on Him. God will cause us to mount up on eagles' wings.
