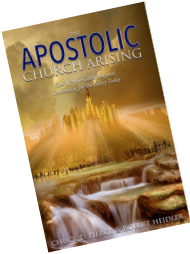

BiMonthly Meeting Minutes LeGrand Friends – August 13

Le Grand Bi-Monthly Meeting met after worship today with 13 members present. Clerk Jay Wyatt opened the meeting with prayer and Denise Phipps read the minutes from the June meeting. They were approved as read.

Treasurer Nancy Slingluff presented her reports for the months of June & July. For June, giving was \$9,769.76 and expenses were \$8,606.00. For July, giving was \$10,847.35 & expenses were \$11,807.73. July expenses reflect new AC unit and Nancy noted that giving has been very steady. Meeting approved these reports.

Pastor Alan went over his reports for June & July. Average June attendance for worship was 73; average July attendance was 70. Pastor noted that for next year, we might want to remember to change the dates for “Food, Fire & Film” event so it’ll be dark enough. Also, noted how well VBS went & that he spent several days in Oskaloosa for IAYM Sessions. Meeting approved his reports.

Phil Rush reported for Trustees that it would be beneficial to have regular maintenance on heating/cooling units at church & parsonage. They got the Maple tree trimmed up in front. Discussion was held on the small food pantry unit’s placement & construction that the Girl Scout Troop will sponsor. Trustees will approve the size & placement.

Chuck Sawyer announced for Ministry & Counsel that Michelle Stubbs will be our new youth leader. Meeting approved & her contract will be finalized at a later date. Chuck also encourage all to consider joining Bible studies, they will be held on Monday & Thursday nights at 6:30.

Pastor said that since Friday, September 22nd, will be a bye week for East Marshall’s football team, it’d be great to have a movie night for the community. Pastor also noted that as of this day, four people had signed up for the mission work trip to Belize. Chuck Sawyer closed the meeting with prayer.

Work Team to BELIZE

This November we are planning to take a work team to Belize City, Belize to work on the Friends School and Church. The team consists of Travis Vaughn, Lloyd Stangeland, Gary Bryant and Alan Mullikin. In Belize, once you finish the 6th grade you are mandated to take a test which you must pass if you are going to be allowed to continue in formal education. The Friends School is there to assist the kids who have not passed it, to help them learn and grow so that they can have a legitimate chance to pass the test and then have opportunities to get back into the state schools. Those who do not pass the test, have very limited scholastic as well as employment opportunities.

The school is relocating to a different building which needs some alterations to be set up for their intended usage. Friends are also beginning a church in the building. Our job is to help in whatever is needed to accomplish those alterations. It could be erecting and finishing walls, painting, repairs, basically whatever is needed. We plan to leave Friday November 3rd and return Thursday, November 9th. The costs are \$45 per day for room and board while there as well as the flight to and from (approximately \$600). Additional expenses are one day of sight-seeing, travel food, and souvenirs. Please keep this team in your prayers.
