Friends,

When I was young, some would play with with two cups and a string tying them together to form a rudimentary phone. As far as I know, it did not work well. About that same time I remember visiting my grandparents who lived outside of town and they were part of a party line. I can't remember exactly what their ring was, whether two shorts and a long or something like that, but I do remember that you had to be mindful that others might very well be listening in. Then along came walkee talkees! The ones we could afford were not fancy, and frankly, not very clear to listen to, with static sometimes overwhelming the sound of voices. But then something amazing came along called a . . . pager. This wonderful device would let you know that someone was trying to reach you and you could then locate a land line and call them back! Oh the wonder!! Finally, the cell phone became available for regular folks like me. I was then reachable almost everywhere and no longer tied to a land line. You can even use a program called Face Time and do video conferencing from across the country and world. Wow, we live in amazing times.

So where are we in our communication with the Living God? Are we hearing Him more and more clearly, perhaps even some frequent video conferencing it is so clear? Or are we hearing Him with minor interruptions of distortions as we realize that "we see through a glass darkly and are yet to see face to face?" (1 Cor 13:12 paraphrase) Maybe our connection is more periodic, like walkee talkees, with quite a bit of static, but we hear God's words in the midst, or we are getting more often reminded to contact God as He reaches out to encourage more time with him like a pager? Or maybe we are just beginning our walk with Him and it seems hard to believe we can hear from the Holy Spirit, like when the two cups were tied by a string. My point is, God wants us to seek Him, to desire fervently to hear His voice and listen. He will make His voice more and more plain to us as we increase our time and focus to hear.

And then as we hear, we must be willing to act upon His instruction. As we read and learn from His word, the Bible; as we pray and hear His voice whisper instructions and direction; as we hear from Him through prophets and other fervent followers of Christ. May God make His plan to us increasingly clear and may He be glorified as we live for Him.

God sent His son Jesus into the world to offer Himself as a sacrifice out of God's amazing love for us, so that we might be able to establish this intimate relationship with Him that will grow because of our conversations with Him.
