

May is also Mother's Day Month. Come bring your Mom to the post. We will be having specials with Champagne.


May 29th is Memorial Day and we will be hosting a service at the Cemetery, with a pot luck to follow at the post.

### *National Commander's project helps needy children and service officers.*

American Legion service officers today are helping more than 700,000 veterans and their families, free of charge, file disability claims, benefits applications and other forms of assistance. Meanwhile, military and veteran families with minor children at home, when struck with unexpected costs that leave them unable to pay for basic household needs, receive more than \$500,000 in emergency funding a year from The American Legion's Temporary

Financial Assistance program.

Both programs depend on charitable contributions to offer the free Assistance.

That's why American Legion National Commander Charles E. Schmidt has made service officer training and Temporary Financial Assistance for needy families with children at home the focus of his fundraising project this year.
