HISTORY OF KING SOLOMON LODGE NO. 5 AT PROMETHEUS LODGE NO. 87



NOW. "SEARS GETS FINAL SHOT AT SURVIVAL NEXT WEEK"

"Billionaire Edward Lampert will get one last chance to keep Sears Holdings Corp. from closing down..."

Wall Street Journal, January 9, 2019

Then. SEARS, ROEBUCK, CATALOGUE #117 - 1908

Richard Warren Sears was born in Stewartville, Minnesota in 1863. In 1866, while serving as Station Agent at North Redwood, Minnesota, a local jeweler refused a shipment of watches. The shipper offered them on consignment to Sears. The deal proved so profitable that he ordered more watches for resale through other Station Agents, reaching the point in a few months where he quit the railroad to set up a full time mail order business. In 1887 he moved the business to Chicago to take advantage of better transportation facilities and a more central location for his burgeoning business. Within a month of his arrival in Chicago, Sears advertisement for a watch repair man was answered by Alvah Curtis Roebuck of Hammond, Indiana. A series of business logistic gyrations took its toll on Roebuck, who decided to sell out and retire in 1895. The first catalog appeared in 1891 consisting of 32 pages of watches quickly growing over the years to 1,184 pages in 1908.

Ring: Solid Gold Emblem - \$4.12; with diamonds - \$6.60

Charm: Gold filled - \$2.15

Locket: Solid Gold, stone center, Masonic price - \$3.40


Jewell: Blue, enameled, gold filled, Masonic price - \$1.10; Same style but cheaper quality - .88

Pins: Gold filled, enameled & engraved .43 or Solid Gold - .68.

WHERE OH WHERE IS The "DAM BOX"....

Believe it is time for The "DAM BOX" 's existence and location be made known to all of our Arizona Lodges.

The "DAM BOX", although badly charred, survived the fire that destroyed Winslow Lodge. The "Dam Box" originated

with Glen Canyon Lodge, which was started by the builders of the Glen Canyon Dam on the Colorado River. This dam formed Lake Powell. The "DAM BOX" was to be a traveling presentation, inducing the recipient lodge to travel to another lodge and present it to them and instruct them that they were to travel to another lodge and present them with the "DAM BOX" and to repeat the event. It is my understanding that when Glen Canyon Lodge surrendered their charter, Winslow Lodge 13 inherited the "DAM BOX". At some time in the past Winslow sneaked it into Sy Harrison Lodge (Payson Lodge?), who in turn sneaked it into Apache Lodge. Travels from that time until it was found in the rubble of the destroyed lodge is unknown.



On July 9th, 2018, 11 Sy Harrison Lodge Brothers traveled to Winslow and presented Winslow Lodge #13 with a box to carry and display the "DAM BOX". Brothers making the trip were WBrothers John Elliott, John Brooks, Bruce Halverson and Tom Jones; Brothers Forrest McCoy, Jim Muhr, Herb Dwyer, Bob Harkey, Tom Taylor John "Turtle" Chubbuck

and Jim Gier, Master SHL 70.

Now, there is a travel log attached to the box used to carry the "DAM BOX" so that its travels can be tracked..... Where, oh, where is the "DAM BOX" now?

RIDERS OF THE THIRD DEGREE WITH OVER 4000 TOYS



world


For the past decade, the

Memorial Association has devoted tremendous energy and resources to the renovation of the Memorial. Major exhibits have been added. Interiors have been repaired and repainted. Lighting has been updated. But the most considerable work is the top-to-bottom restoration of the building itself—the first such renovation since the Memorial was completed nearly a century ago.





Masonic Trivia

In 1900 the Grand Master William F. Nichols devoted a large portion of his address to a reproduction of the correspondence in the complaint of Nogales Lodge No. 11 of Nogales, Arizonaagainst Emilo G. Canton Lodge No. 250 of Nogales Sonora México under the jurisdiction of the Gran Dieta Simbolica of Mexico for invasion of jurisdiction. Turns out that in January 1900 the Ermilo G. Canton Lodge, working on the Jurisdiction of 'El Gran Dieta de los Estados Unidos Mexicanos' held a meeting, opened their Lodge and conferred the Entered Apprentice Degree upon five candidates in the Odd Fellows Hall in the town of Nogales, Arizona. Three of the five candidates resided in the town of Nogales Arizona. The Master of the Mexican Lodge was quoted "Besides all this, dear brother, I cannot understand in what consists the invasion of foreign jurisdiction, as, in the Masonic world as well as in the profane, the meetings of a peaceful and familiar nature can be held in this country, as well as in the neighboring one, without conflict with the neutrality; and, in order to cause invasion, it would be necessary, as such an act indicates, we would have to invade faculties or rights exclusively reserved to that Lodge, all of which we are far from pretending to do as in our meeting the jurisdiction ends within the precinct or within the walls of the temple." A very loose interpretation of jurisdiction that was settlement was made through a waiver of jurisdiction. Later resolutions were adopted in forbidding the subletting of a Masonic



Lodge subordinate to the Grand Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons in Arizona to a foreign Masonic Body and that no Lodge had the right to waive jurisdiction over its material in favor of any foreign Lodge.



On April 3, 1936 the Grand Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons in Arizona received an official invitation from the The Grand Lodge of Antient Free and Accepted Masons of Scotland for our Grand Lodge to send representation to the Bi-Centenary celebration in November. MWB Edwin Seymour Miller was born in Sherman, NY in 1858. He graduated from University of Buffalo Medical School in 1879. Due to severe asthma he moved to the open prairies of North Dakota where he, with others, founded the city of New Rockford. He built the first drug store and served as Postmaster. He made his way to Flagstaff, Arizona in 1896 where he became well known in the community, with a large practice serving as physician, surgeon, dentist, and nurse. For many years he served as physician for the Santa Fe Railroad. He started his Masonic career in Carrington Lodge U.D. in North Dakota, and was passed and raised in Flagstaff Masonic Lodge #7 where he served as Master in 1901-1903. He served as Grand Master of Grand Lodge of Free & Accepted Masons in Arizona in 1905


You will need to procure your own costume and tuxedo. We are in the process of obtaining dispensation from both jurisdictions and more details to follow.
