Medicare preventive visit & yearly wellness exams

f you are covered by Medicare Part B, you ımay want to take advantage of the of the "Welcome to Medicare" preventive visit or the yearly wellness exam. The information below was taken from the Medicare website and gives an overview of these visits.

Medicare Part B (Medical Insurance) covers:

A "Welcome to Medicare" preventive visit:

You can get this visit only within the first 12 months you have Part B. This visit includes a review of your medical and social history related to your health and education and counseling about preventive services, including these:

- Certain screenings, shots, and referrals for other care, if needed
- Height, weight, and blood pressure measurements
- A calculation of your body mass index
- A simple vision test
- A review of your potential risk for depression and your level of safety
- An offer to talk with you about creating advance
- A written plan letting you know which screenings, shots, and other preventive services you

This visit is covered one time. You don't need to have this visit to be covered for yearly "Wellness" visits.

What to expect during your "Welcome to Medicare" preventive

Your doctor will:

• Record and evaluate your medical and family history, current health conditions, and prescriptions.

 Check your blood pressure, vision, weight, and height to get a baseline for

your care.

- Make sure you're upto-date with preventive screenings and services, like cancer screenings and
- Order further tests. depending on your general health and medical history.
- After the visit, your doctor will give you a plan or checklist with free screenings and preventive services that you need.

What to bring to your "Welcome to Medicare" preventive visit

Medical records, including immunization records. Even if your current doctor does the visit, gather as much medical information as you can to make sure nothing is missed.

Family health history. Try to learn as much as you can about your family's health history before your appointment. The information will help you and your doctor better understand what screenings you need to get and what to watch for in the future.

Prescription drugs. Bring a list of any prescription drugs, over-the-counter drugs, vitamins, and supplements that you currently take, how often you take them, and why.

Yearly "Wellness" visits:

If you've had Part B for longer than 12 months, you can get this visit to develop or update a personalized prevention help plan.

This plan is designed to help prevent disease and disability based on your current health and risk factors. Your provider will ask you to fill out a questionnaire, called a "Health Risk Assessment," as part of this visit. Answering these questions can help you and your provider develop a personalized prevention plan to help you stay healthy and get the most out of your visit. It can also include:

- A review of your medical and family history
- Developing or updating a list of current providers and prescriptions
- Height, weight, blood pressure, and other routine measurements
- Detection of any cognitive impairment
- Personalized health · A list of risk factors and
- treatment options for you • A screening schedule
- (like a checklist) for appropriate preventive services. • Advance care planning This visit is covered once every 12 months (11 full

months must have passed

since the last visit). Who's eligible?

All people with Part B are covered.

You pay nothing for the "Welcome to Medicare" preventive visit or the yearly "Wellness" visit if your doctor or other qualified health care provider accepts assignment. The Part B deductible doesn't apply.

However, you may have to pay coinsurance, and the Part B deductible may apply if:

Your doctor or other health care provider performs additional tests or services during the same

MIAMI — The Ottawa County Health Department is here to serve you. Our dedicated staff will help you get the services you need.

We still have flu vaccine available for the community at no out of pocket cost. Our Women, Infant, and Children (WIC) department is offered 4 days a week.

WIC provides nutritional assistance and education for Women and their Children up to age 5.

The Ottawa County Health Department tests children from 6 months to 6 years of age for lead.

High blood lead levels have shown to potentially cause developmental delays in children. Come in and get your child

Beginning in April, our family planning (birth control) will be offered two days a week by our nurse practitioner.

The practitioner will spend the time to go over all the options that are available to you, so you can make the best decision for yourself.

Our skilled nursing staff is available for any questions you might have or

that arise after your visit. Our Children's First program (C1) is dedicated to first time mothers who are less than 29 weeks into their pregnancy.

Our nurses are specially trained to offer free, inhome visitation services. Our nurses will answer questions and share information about personal health, child development, parenting skills, home safety, and community resources.

Another program that is offered by the Health Department is the SoonerStart program that is designed to help meet the needs of families with infants and toddlers (birth through age three) who have disabilities and/or developmental delays.

Our highly trained Early Intervention staff provides screenings, assessments, family training, education, in-home support, specialized services and therapy, as well as community referrals.
