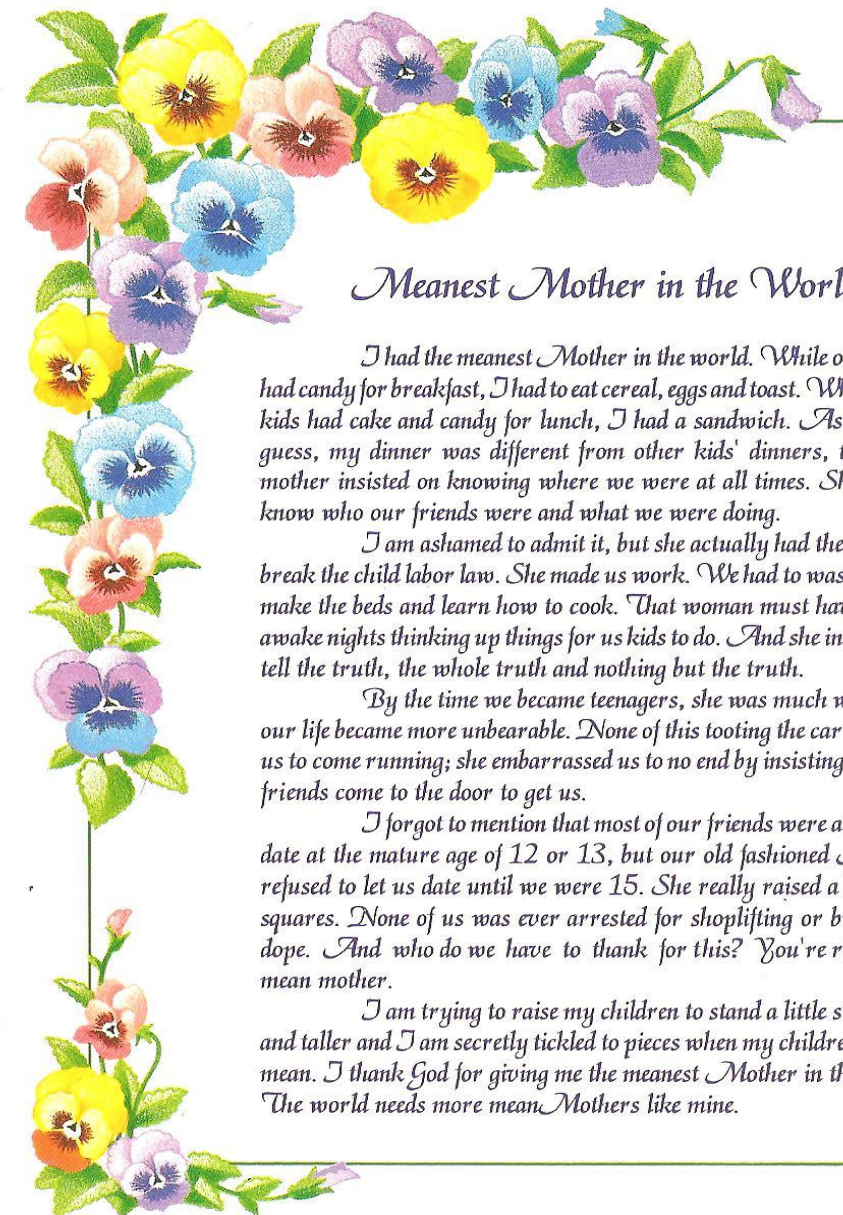

- 3. **love**: "Grant, Lord, that my children may learn to live a life of love, through the Spirit who dwells in them." (Col. 3:14)
- 4. **self-control**: "Father, help my children not to be like many others around them, but let them be alert and self-controlled in all they do." (1 Thes. 5:6)
- 5. **honesty & integrity**: "May integrity and honesty be their virtue and their protection." (Ph. 4:8)

"Well, if Timmy's mom says it's OK, that's good enough for me."

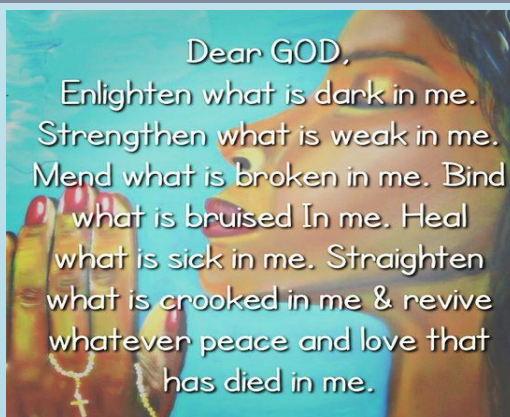
"The curfew is just a general time to shoot for. It's not like I'm running a prison around here."
