This week's Bible readings Luke 13.31-35 · Genesis 15.1-12,17-18 · Philippians 3.17–4.1

Growing in confidence

Notes on the Bible readings

• Jesus' encounter with some seemingly sympathetic Pharisees confirms that he must be 'on his way' (v.33) and will not be turned from the path before him. There isn't a flicker of the fear of Gethsemane, but instead a firm resolve to continue towards Jerusalem, the city that kills prophets. The stance of Jerusalem's religious leaders is entrenched, so they place themselves firmly on the road to ruin, both cosmic (Philippians 3.19) and literal (v.35). The destruction of the Temple in AD 70 had happened by the time Luke was writing.

• Jesus uses a rare female image in describing himself as a mother hen facing off Herod the fox (Luke 13.34). But this hen and her chicks cannot be snatched away – the power of heaven is behind them. The fox is only a threat when the chicks are outside the security of the hen's wings, but people can choose or reject heavenly protection.

• The truth of Psalm 27 is written in the very nature of Jesus – heaven is his true home and his identity isn't something that can be distorted by any outside force, no matter how pressured or deadly. Paul reminds us that our citizenship is in heaven (Philippians 3.20). He prompts us to 'stand firm in the Lord' (4.1) when we find ourselves under pressure, and allow our identity in Christ and heavenly values to affect our behaviour now, so that 'on our way' we may fulfil God's kingdom purposes.

May they have vision and compassion to act in ways that are beneficial to all. In the name of Christ, we pray. Amen.
