A certain woman

Notes on the Bible readings

- Paul is called by a Macedonian man in a dream to cross the sea from Turkey to Macedonia (northern Greece), to visit Europe for the first time. He is led by the Holy Spirit to the Greek city of Philippi, in the Roman Empire.
- Lydia is a God-fearing Gentile and prominent local businesswoman, who sells expensive purple cloth, dyed in her home town of Thyatira. A lot of women were attracted to Jewish values and beliefs at this time. Philippi had a small Jewish population and probably no synagogue, so on the sabbath Paul goes to the river, which was a place where local people were known to pray. Lydia hears Paul teaching by the river and the Lord 'opens her heart' (v.14).
- Lydia's curiosity leads her to believe in Paul's God and Paul baptizes her and her whole household (suggesting she was head of the family). In accepting her hospitality, Paul is demonstrating, like Peter, his acceptance of Gentiles. Lydia's openness to divine initiative leads to her conversion – the first in Europe – so it was a significant event in the life of the Early Church.
- In John 14, Jesus promises to send his disciples the Holy Spirit as 'a helper'. The Holy Spirit is not a tangible being and the disciples need to move from trusting a physical person to trusting God's voice in a different way. How open and responsive are we to the promptings of the Holy Spirit?
