

FRANKLIN HELD A PRIMARY.

HON. W. H. COBB NOMINATED FOR STATE SENATE.

The Primary Was Harmonious and the Democrats Will All Stand Together in the Election.

Carnesville, Ga., July 27.—(Special.)—
The democrats of Franklin held their county primary today and settled by ballot a number of interesting contests that have absorbed public attention for the last few weeks. The results so far ascertained show the nomination of Hon. W. H. Cobb, one of the ablest democrats of Franklin county, for the seat of the thirty-first district in the state senate. Hon. W. R. Little is the nominee of the party for the office of ordinary.

The greatest degree of harmony prevailed at the precincts of the county and one of the largest party votes ever cast in Franklin was registered today. Many of the contests have at this hour not been determined, but win or lose, the men who were candidates today will stand together for victory in the election when the populist nominees must be met.

Hon. W. H. Cobb, who will make the race for the senate, is well known over the district and his popularity with the people will have much to do with the

result, which will in all probability be in his favor. Hon. W. R. Little, the nominee for ordinary, has represented his county in the legislature and his district in the senate more than once and some of the most salutary measures on the statute book owe their authorship to him.

The democrats of Franklin, Hart and Habersham will make a strong fight in the election. The contests over the party nominations have been active and determined, but with the primary over, the defeated candidates announce their readiness and willingness to support the victorious against the common enemy. With this harmonious feeling prevailing in Franklin, it is believed the election will go democratic by a handsome majority.
