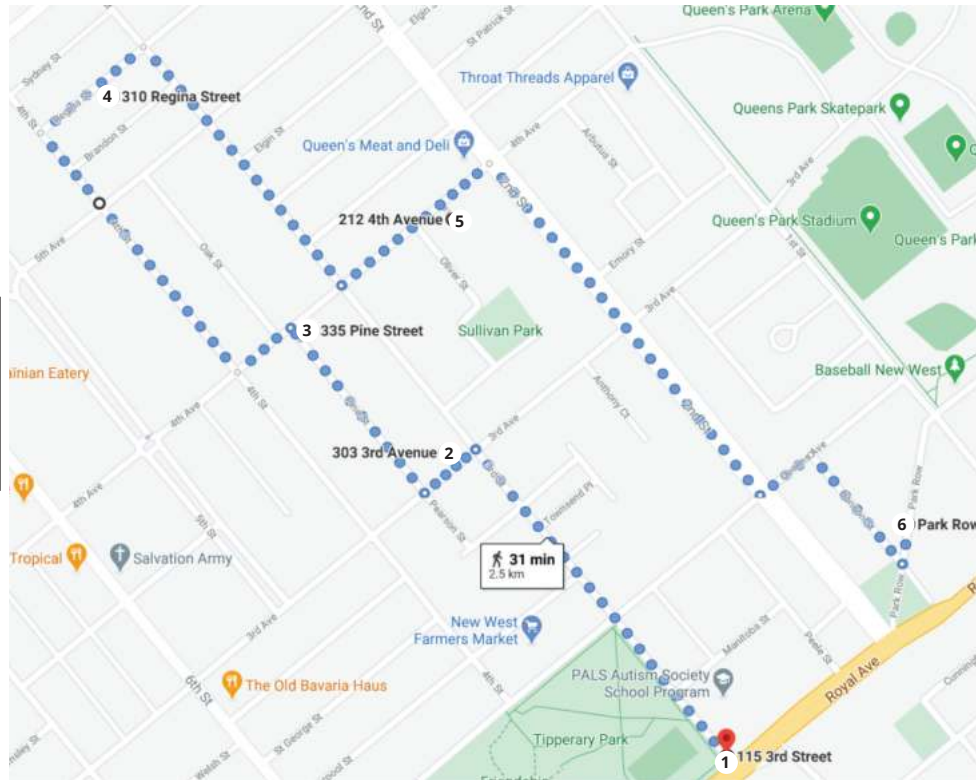


Queen's Park Neighbourhood • Then and Now

New Westminster being one of the oldest cities in B.C. - we have history! Sometimes it's preserved and sometimes it's not.

Take this neighbourhood tour and compare the photos from the New Westminster Museum Archives to the present.

Please be mindful these are private residences--do not trespass or disturb the residents.

1. Northwest corner of Park Row and Bonson Street - Thomas Mowat residence (ca. 1890's).
2. 212 Fourth Avenue photo - taken around 1911 - 1912.
3. 310 Regina Street - initially built in 1909, this photo was taken around 1982.
4. 335 Pine Street - Arthur and Charlotte Green House, built in 1910.
5. 303 Third Avenue - H.T. Kirk home (ca. 1906)– it later became the Slater Dancing School.
6. 115 Third Street - the G.E. Corbould residence (ca. 1900).

THE LIST SHOULD READ AS FOLLOWS:

1. **115 Third Street** - the G.E. Corbould residence (ca 1900)
2. **303 Third Avenue** - H.T. Kirk home (ca 1906). It later became the Slater Dancing School.
3. **335 Pine Street** - Arthur and Charlotte Green house, built in 1910
4. **310 Regina Street** - initially built in 1909, this photo was taken around 1982.
5. **212 Fourth Avenue** photo - taken around 1911-1912
6. **Northwest corner of Park Row and Bonson Street** - Thomas Mowat residence (ca 1890s)
