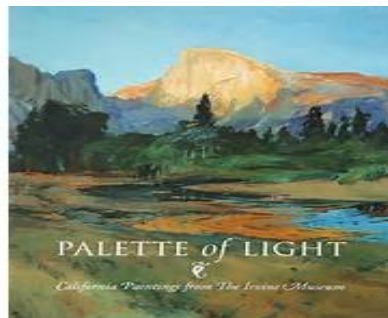

The financial help that We Care has provided has been such an encouragement and a light of hope for our home.

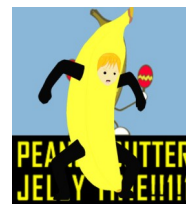
We are one step (or should I say, many steps closer to where we need to be).

Buttermilk Pancakes

4 large eggs	3 t baking powder
2 C buttermilk	1 T sugar
1 1/2 C flour	1/2 t salt
1 t soda	6 T butter


Beat eggs until frothy. Add buttermilk. Blend in dry ingredients. Add melted butter and beat for 3 minutes. *Can be easily mixed all together in a blender* but not mixed as long. Pour each pancake on a medium hot cast iron griddle. Wait until bubbles form in the middle, then turn them over quickly, let rise a little and voila! Pull each one out, put on a plate, wrap around a cooked sausage and you have pigs in a blanket.

Tip: Spray a little Pam, then wipe off excess w/ paper towel on the cast iron skillet for one or long cast iron grill (flat side) for two pancakes at once.
