Huguette was born in 1906, the second child of the then 67-year-old US Senator William A Clark and his 28-year-old second wife, Anna La Chapelle. A copper-mining robber baron, Clark was one of the richest men in America. When he died, in 1925, he left around \$3.5bn in today's money. Four children having survived from his first marriage (and her sister, Andrée, having died of meningitis at 16), a fifth of this fortune went to the 19-year-old Huguette. To do with it forms the bulk of Dedman's narrative.

After the tour, we will shop and have lunch in Old Town Orange. Return home whenever you'd like. Maps will be provided.


