CASA ROMANTICA CULTURAL CENTER AND GARDENS

Sits on a bluff overlooking the Pacific Ocean in San Clemente. The beautiful Spanish Revival house, built in 1927, was once the summer home of Ole Hanson, the founder of San Clemente.

Many unique features are to be seen in the house: There is an outdoor family room called The Barbecue with an unusual "beehive" fireplace; an inner courtyard with encaustic tile flooring; the original keyhole shaped entry door; a teak screen carved in China; original and replaced decorative lighting; and a tile shower large enough for the Hanson children to take their pony

inside to give it a bath. Two murals painted by Norman Kennedy in 1928 in wall niches in the courtyard have been repaired and restored. The gardens contain many plants indigenous to coastal California.

Period photographs of southern California are on display as well as other exhibits in the galleries. We will have docent tours of the house and gardens.

There is a \$5.00 per person admission charge to be paid when we enter. The tour of the house will be approximately 45 minutes. After, there will be leisure time to spend in the gardens. There are some stairs with rails in the gardens.

The walking is easy but wear comfortable walking shoes.

Lunch will be at the **Fisherman** on the San Clemente Pier which is below the bluff.

Our tour of the house is scheduled for 11:00 a.m. which is when Casa Romantica opens. **PLEASE MEET BY 9:45 a.m.** at Pavilions parking lot off Bolsa Ave. We should leave there no later than 10:00 a.m.
