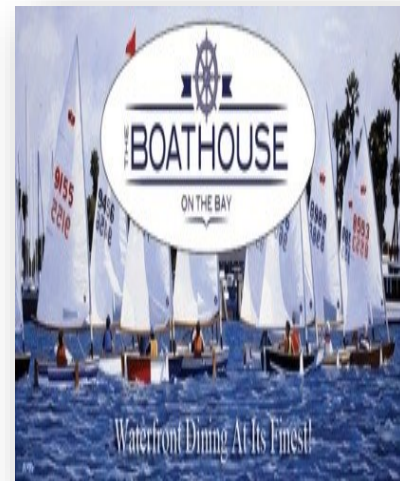
Thurs., December 15
