



The **Cerritos Library**, the **New Cerritos Library**, or the **Cerritos Public Library** is the civic library for the City of Cerritos, California. It was rededicated on March 16, 2002, with the new moniker and the current futuristic design. It was the first building to feature an exterior clad with titanium panels in the United States. It boasts to be the first "Experience Library" and focuses

on themed spaces, high quality artwork, and inspirational architecture rather than being another library in the traditional sense.

Join us as we take a one hour tour of the library and enjoy visiting various exhibits, including works by Dale Chihuly, admire the children's section of the library and get first hand information about the workings of the library. The tour begins at 10 a.m. Af-
