OPERATIONS FOREMAN

DEPARTMENT: Operations

<u>REPORTS TO</u>: Chief Operator

<u>SUPERVISES</u>: Operators and Relief Operator

GENERAL DESCRIPTION OF POSITION:

Responsible for ensuring proper and efficient operation of the main plant, excess flow facility, wet weather retention facility, biosolids facility, and lift stations; and for ensuring that the operating personnel are working efficiently and productively.

QUALIFICATIONS AND JOB REQUIREMENTS:

The position requires an associates degree in a technical field and a minimum of three years of supervisory experience in plant operations. Lack of a post high school education or supervisory experience can be offset by additional operating experience. Experience with a computerized control system is required. Must have ability to work with people and direct a work force. Must be able to respond to emergency situations 24 hours per day, 7 days per week.

TYPICAL DUTIES:

- 1. Supervise the plant operators and the relief operator in the performance of their duties.
- 2. Assist operators with routine operating problems and high flows.
- 3. Calibrate and maintain basic process control type instruments and meters as directed by the Chief Operator.
- 4. Prepare and review operating records, computer data, and laboratory results on a daily basis.
- 5. Provide instruction and training of operators and relief operator as needed for existing, new, or modified operating procedures. Conduct monthly safety meetings as directed by the Chief Operator.
- 6. Maintain a log of operating problems and coordinate routine maintenance and repairs with the Maintenance Foreman.
- 7. Maintain an inventory of routine chemicals and operating supplies.
- 8. Coordinate operator work schedules and maintain time-keeping records.

- 9. Maintain a program for exercising idle equipment, valves and gates. Maintain the condition of off-line tanks.
- 10. Read and interpret equipment manuals to determine proper operational procedures.

ENVIRONMENT:

Works in the operating treatment plant with its related hazards. Must be able to inspect plant equipment and make evaluations. Works with a minimal amount of direct supervision.

As a public employee in a position of major responsibility, the individual is expected to display the appropriate public conduct.
