IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS OF DAY CAMPERS

DROP OFF AND PICK UP FOR DAY CAMPERS:

Day camp hours are Monday to Friday from 9:00 am to 4:30 pm. Please advise us if you are going to be late. All campers must check in and check out with the Day Camp Supervisor. Cars should park in the south side meadow off the 13th line - green farm gate adjacent to 3155. Parents should accompany their campers to the check in area for check in and out. No dogs are allowed in camp.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP:

From the south: take Simcoe Road 88 to the lights at the 10th Side Road (PetroCan Station). Travel north 8 km to the 13th line. Turn left (west). Continue approximately 250 metres to #3155 on the left (south) side.

From the north: Take Hwy. 89 to the 10th Side Road (east of Cookstown Outlet Mall). Travel south on the 10th SR to the 13th line. Turn right (west) and continue approximately 250 metres to #3155 on the left (south) side.

if you are going to be late or your child will not be attending one that day please leave a message on the camp telephone (905) 775-2694

OPTIONAL ADDITIONAL COSTS:

For Riders: Riding helmets and safety vests may be rented at: \$10.00 for a helmet and \$15.00 for a vest. Please note that insurance regulations require that all riders wear approved head gear. Bike or hockey helmets are not acceptable.

For Paintball: Paintballs are sold at 100 balls for \$10.00. For reasons of safety and quality control all paintballs must be purchased from our inventory. Campers may not bring paintballs into camp.

LUNCH:

Campers should bring their own lunch from home each day. Lunches should be clearly labelled with the camper's name as they will be kept in the kitchen and distributed during the lunch period.

Please note: The Hollows Camp is a peanut free environment.

CAMPER CODE OF CONDUCT:
