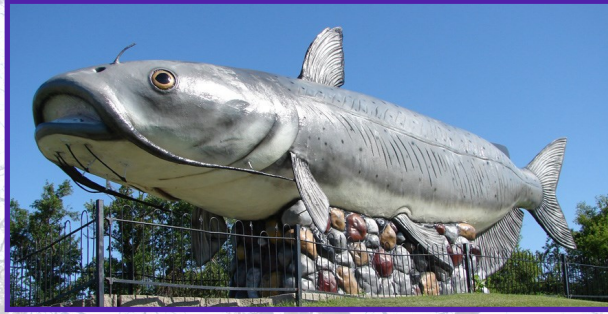


7. "Wahpper"



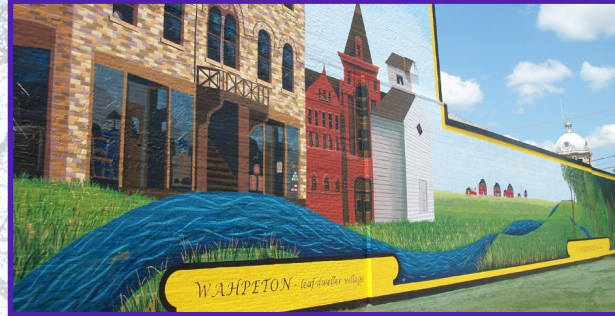
“Wahpper,” the world’s largest catfish at 40 feet long, is located at Kidder Recreation area, home to several great shore-fishing areas.

Top 10 Things to Do in Wahpeton

1. Chahinkapa Zoo



Over 200 animals representing six continents and 100 species populate Chahinkapa Zoo. Two white rhinos, new to the zoo in 2018, highlight a populace that includes an orangutan, grizzly bears, zebras, Bengal tigers, otters, spider monkeys, kangaroos, and much more. 2. Red Door Art Gallery
